Apex court to resolve border row with Nagaland: Sarma

GUWAHATI, July 16: Having initiated talks with Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh to resolve the inter-state border rows, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Saturday said the Assam government was also trying to open dialogue with Mizoram, while the dispute with Nagaland will be resolved in the Supreme Court.

"The issue with Nagaland is not very easy. Both the states have agreed that the dispute will be resolved in Supreme Court. In the meantime, both the governments will take development initiatives in the sensitive areas," Sarma said at a press conference here.

Informing that Assam and Nagaland governments were in touch over the issue, he said both sides have also agreed not to do anything which will "harm the friendship".

In case of the border dispute with Mizoram, Sarma

said Assam was taking steps to open a dialogue and Cabinet minister Atul Bora is scheduled to visit the neighbouring state soon for the purpose.

Stating that Friday's meeting with his Arunachal Pradesh counterpart Pema Khandu followed by

'Namsai Declaration landmark move for creating a united Northeast'

the signing of the 'Namsai Declaration' was a "landmark move" from the point of view of creating a "united Northeast", Sarma said the 28 'disputed' villages which Arunachal Pradesh will keep were well within the constitutional boundary of the neighbouring state. "The deputy commis-

sioners of Assam have surveyed them and found that they are 15-20 km inside the Arunachal boundary. The Survey of India map also clearly shows it. Wonder how they were marked as disputed... maybe both sides were not talking enough and ground surveys were never done," he claimed.

"We feel we will find another 20-25 such villages where there should not be any dispute. However, around 10-15 areas could be tough to resolve and we will have to work on it. But yesterday's meeting generated a confidence that we can resolve the issue," Sarma said.

In case of Meghalaya, the Chief Minister was hopeful of finding a resolution in case of four more areas of difference - apart from the six already resolved - soon. "The Survey of India will give a modified boundary between Assam and Meghalaya. We are proceeding in the right direction," he said.

No shortage of fund for flood relief: CM

1.8 lakh families to get Rs 3,800 'utensil grant', Rs 1,000 textbook grant for over 1 lakh students

GUWAHATI, July 16: The two waves of devastating floods in Assam have posed various challenges, and the State Government was trying to mitigate the hardship of the people on "individual basis" and with the Centre declaring the nature's fury as a "severe calamity", there should not be any fund shortage, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said on Saturday.

While 1.8 lakh affected families are being provided a 'utensil grant' of Rs 3,800 each, over one lakh students will get Rs 1,000 as special textbook grant, Sarma told a press conference.

He said the assistance was being given through direct benefit transfer (DBT) from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund.

He said the Education department will launch an exercise to provide free textbooks to students who lost their belongings in the floods.

He said the next task of the Government is to make an assessment of the fully and partially damaged houses. "So far, we have a figure

of 25,670 fully or severely damaged houses, majority of which are in Cachar district. Over 2.78 lakh houses have been damaged partially. Guardian ministers and officers of their departments will conduct a verification of 10 per cent of the beneficiaries from July 20, so that no ineligible person gets the assistance," Sarma said.

The Government plans to spend around Rs 400 crore on families whose houses have been damaged. While over Rs 1,000 crore would be required to rebuild damaged infrastructure like roads, bridges, embankments and school buildings, the Chief Minister said that all such works would be sanctioned by September 30.

"We are getting full cooperation from the Central Government. Funds are being released in the 90:10 ratio. Union Home Minister Amit Shah has asked me to keep spending and the Centre would keep releasing the fund... there is no need for any package as such," he said.

He also said that ex-gratia payment of Rs 4 lakh has been released to the next of kin of all the 195 people who lost their lives in the floods.

"Perhaps, this was the highest ever casualty figure in floods in the State. Thirty seven people are still missing. If we fail to find them, we will have to declare them untraced," he said.

In the two waves of floods since April 6, as many as 9,918 villages in 152 revenue circles of 34 districts were affected.

"Around 90 lakh people - one-third of the State's population - were hit. The livestock toll stands at 54,837, while a crop area of 2.4 lakh hectares has been affected," he said, adding that 7.42 lakh people had to be sheltered in relief camps, the highest ever till date.

"That we had to distribute 2.19 lakh quintals of rice over and above the normal free rice which people get, shows how mammoth the relief operation was. Close to one lakh people had to be evacuated. The IAF conducted 77 sorties to air-drop essentials in Dima Hasao and Barak valley," he said.

He said there has been no diarrhoea or cholera outbreak in the flood-affected areas. The Government is also trying for a moratorium for the flood-hit people who had taken small loans.

'ULFA (I) internal matter of Assam, not of Northeast'

GUWAHATI, July 16: Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Saturday said that the ULFA (I) issue is an "internal matter" of the State and not of the entire Northeast, which can be resolved through dialogue.

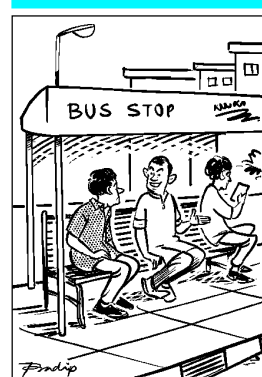
Addressing a press conference, Sarma said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah were keen to solve problems of the Northeast so that the region can remain united in the path of progress.

Asked whether the issue of the banned ULFA (I) is expected to be resolved soon, the Chief Minister said that it was not related to the entire NE but was Assam's "internal matter".

"Border disputes, flood, issues related to electrification, communication, internet connectivity and others are related to the Northeast. We are going to deal with these and make the region strong and prosperous in line with the vision of the Prime Minister and the Home Minister," he said. - PTI

Flood situation improves further

GUWAHATI, July 16: Flood situation in the State further improved on Saturday though a population of 1.48 lakh in five districts are still affected, according to the bulletin of the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA).

The water levels of the rivers have further receded and none are flowing above the danger level now. The total affected population declined to 1,48,645 from the previous day's 2,10,746. The death toll remained

unchanged at 195 with no fresh flood-related fatality being reported during the day, the bulletin said.

Water levels of rivers recede, none flowing above danger level

The ASDMA bulletin said 271 villages in six revenue circles of five districts - Cachar, Chirang, Dima Hasao, Morigaon and Tamulpur -

are now inundated. Morigaon is the worst-affected district with a population of 82,823 reeling under the calamity, followed by Cachar where 64,617 were hit.

More than 10,000 people have taken shelter in 43 relief camps.

A total crop area of 400 hectares is still under water, while 71,839 animals have been affected, the bulletin stated.

It said erosion was reported in Bongaigaon, Bishwanath, Barpeta, Golaghat and Tamulpur districts. - PTI

4 more die of JE, toll rises to 27

GUWAHATI, July 16: Four more persons, all from Jorhat district, died of Japanese Encephalitis on Saturday, taking the death toll in this season (July onwards) to 27, officials said.

Nine fresh cases of JE - 3 from Golaghat, 2 each from Sivasagar and Sonitpur, and one each from Goalpara and Kokrajhar - were reported on Saturday, taking the total number of JE cases in this season (July onwards) to 169.

31 killed in Sudan tribal clashes

CAIRO, July 16: At least 31 people were killed in tribal clashes that fired up again on Saturday in a Sudanese southern province, authorities said, the latest bloodshed in a country in turmoil since an October 2021 military coup.

The fighting between the Hausa and the Birta ethnic groups in the Blue Nile province grew out of the killing of a farmer earlier this week, according to a statement from the local Government late on Friday.

The clashes continued on Saturday afternoon despite the deployment of more troops in the region, according to the Sudan's Doctors Committee, which tracks violence across the country.

The local Government deployed the military and paramilitary Rapid Support Forces to bring stability to the region. Authorities also imposed a night curfew and banned gatherings in the area where the clashes took place. - AP

Concern over fate of tribal belts around Guwahati

GUWAHATI, July 16: Tribal organisations of Assam have expressed concern over the fate of the tribal blocks and belts around Guwahati, after the State Government's announcement regarding the proposed expansion of the capital city.

Representatives of the Coordination Committee of the Tribal Organizations of Assam (CCTOA) on Saturday met State Minister for Welfare of Plain Tribe and Welfare of Backward Classes Ranoo Pegu.

"The tribal bodies are

worried about the future of the South Kamrup tribal belt and Gobha tribal block, where a significant number of indigenous people are living for decades, but are yet to get the land *patta*. The tribal population, already lagging behind in several aspects, would be rendered landless and homeless, if action is not taken to protect their interest," said All Assam Tribal Sangha general secretary Aditya Khaklari.

The CCTOA also asked the Government to make it clear what compensation would be given to the people inhabiting those areas if

their land is acquisitioned for the capital expansion project. The tribal bodies are also demanding a survey of the land belonging to the tribal people of the State.

"The minister assured us that even as the expansion of the capital region has been planned, the clauses of the Assam Land and Revenue Regulation, 1886 won't change and the land rights of the tribal and other indigenous people would remain intact," the CCTOA stated.

Another meeting on the land-related problems of the tribal people is scheduled on August 7.

CM orders probe into appointment of 2,274

GUWAHATI, July 16: Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma has directed an inquiry into the alleged illegal appointment of 2,274 staff in the Assam State Transport Corporation (ASTC).

"It has been alleged that the 2,274 contractual staff were recruited without following the due procedure or following the system of reservation nor any interviews were held. The same is to be inquired into and if found to be true, showcause notice to be issued to the then MD, ASTC for flouting the government norms and initiate departmental proceeding against such government officers," minutes of a recent meeting chaired by the Chief Minister with transport department officials said.

After inquiry and on assessment, the transport department will go through the present contractual staff of ASTC and appropriate direction will be issued to keep only essential and legally appointed contractual staff and other staff will be released thereafter. The exercise will be completed within 60 days, the minutes said.

Political opposition translating into hostility, says CJI Ramana

JAIPUR, July 16: Chief Justice of India NV Ramana on Saturday said political opposition is translating into hostility which is not a sign of a healthy democracy and asserted that strong parliamentary democracy demands "strengthening the Opposition as well".

There used to be mutual respect between the government and the Opposition, but the space for opposition is diminishing and laws are being passed without detailed deliberation and scrutiny, he lamented at an event here.

The CJI said the people expect the court to stand as a counterweight to legislative and executive excess and this gains gravity, particularly whenever the Opposition is missing in action.

Instead of engaging in meaningful debates for furthering democracy, politics

has become acrimonious, he said.

"The diversity of opinion enriches polity and society. Political opposition should not translate into hostility, which we are sadly witnessing these days. There are not signs of a healthy democracy," CJI Ramana said.

He was speaking at an event organised at the Rajasthan Assembly by the

Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA) on '75 years of Parliamentary Democracy'.

Ramana, at an earlier event, said non-filling up of judicial vacancies was the main reason for the huge pendency of cases after Union Law Minister Kiren Rijju flagged the backlog of five crore such cases.

The CJI also called for steps to address the "grave" issue of the high number of undertrial prisoners that is affecting the criminal justice system, saying there is a need to question procedures that lead to prolonged incarceration without any trial.

Out of 6.10 lakh prisoners in the country, nearly 80 per cent are undertrial prisoners, he said and lamented that in the criminal justice system, the process "is a punishment". - PTI

Barshashree writes exam at Golaghat jail

DERGAON/GUWAHATI, July 16: Barshashree Buragohain, who was arrested and jailed for allegedly writing a 'seditious' poem, on Saturday sat for her BSc second semester examination inside the Golaghat district jail under strict vigil.

The 19-year-old student had earlier prayed before the Court of the District and Sessions Judge, Golaghat, that she be allowed to appear in the examination held under Dibrugarh University, which the court had subsequently allowed.

Barshashree has been booked under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act.

Meanwhile, the court on Saturday directed the Gola-

ghat district jail authorities to submit a detailed report on the issue of Barshashree appearing for the examination.

The order was passed based on a petition filed by Barshashree's brother. The order directed the jail superintendent to submit a status report on the court order passed on July 14 and 15.

In the petition, it was contended that the very fact that the accused was made to appear in the examination from the jail premises amounts to gross violation of the orders passed on July 14 and 15. The court fixed July 18 as the next date of hearing.

The court also directed the jail authority to allow Barshashree's sister Chinmoyee Buragohain to meet her after following all formalities of the jail.

As per the plea of Jinamoni Bhuyan, the examination centre in-charge of DCB College, Jorhat, the jail authority arranged all the necessary facilities for the examination. Barshashree appeared for her examination at the jail in the morning hours.

At the request of the centre in-charge, the district administration asked Assistant Commissioner Amalan Phukan to serve as the invigilator.

Regarding the allegation that the district administration and the jail authority had violated the norms of the court order on proper venue, Deputy Controller of Examinations of DU, Debapallab Rajkhowa, said that there was no fixed guideline regarding the venue instead of a centre.

"The centre in-charge may arrange any venue or appoint any invigilator with a higher qualification than the examinee. The centre in-charge of an examination is solely responsible for conducting an examination with proper guidelines," he said.

Rajkhowa said the university always wants to provide a proper facility to a candidate to sit for any examination. However, the centre in-charge of DCB College informed the university that Barshashree would appear in the exam from the jail premises.

While contacted, Deputy Commissioner Mrigesh Narayan Baruah said there was no violation of the court orders and the guidelines of examinations under DU.

Culture of garnering votes through freebies 'very dangerous': PM

JALAUN (UP), July 16: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday cautioned people against what he called a "revadi culture" of offering freebies for votes and said this is "very dangerous" for the development of the country.

The Prime Minister used 'revadi', a popular north Indian sweet often distributed during festivals, as a metaphor for freebies being promised by various parties to grab power and said the people, especially the youth should guard against this.

Addressing a gathering here after inaugurating the 296-km Bundelkhand expressway constructed at a cost of around Rs 14,850 crore, Modi said this expressway will not only give speed to the vehicles, but will also accelerate the industrial progress of the entire Bundelkhand.

He said the distance from Chitrakoot to Delhi by the Bundelkhand expressway has been reduced by three-four hours, but its benefit is much more than that and hit out at previous dis-

pensations in Uttar Pradesh for the lack of connectivity.

The "double-engine" government now was ensuring the major transformation of the state with fast-improving connectivity and much better law and order, he said.

Modi asserted that no such work should be done that is not related to the present aspirations and better future of the country.

The thinking behind every decision and policy should be that development of the country would be accelerated, the Prime Minister said, adding that it should be ensured that all those things that harm and negatively impact the country's development are kept away.

Modi said the country has got a very good opportunity for development and it should not let this go.

"We have to ensure maximum development in this era and take the country to new heights and build a new India," he said.

Modi said the new India also

faces a challenge, which if overlooked now, would be harmful to this generation.

"Your present will be lost and your future pushed into darkness. It is important to be vigilant", he added.

"In our country today, attempts are being made to bring a culture of garnering votes by distributing 'revadis'. This 're-

vadi culture' is very dangerous for the development of the country. People of the country and especially the youth need to guard against this culture," Modi said.

He said those indulging in 'revadi culture' will never make new expressways, airports and defence corridors. "The 'revadi culture' people

think they will buy out people by distributing free 'revadis'. We have to jointly defeat this thinking of theirs. Have to remove 'revadi culture' from the country's politics," Modi said without taking any names.

Modi's remarks were targeted at parties that have been resorting to giving away freebies, especially before polls. — PTI

Uttar Pradesh MLAs' vote value highest, Sikkim's lowest

NEW DELHI, July 16: As elected lawmakers from across the country gear up for voting in the presidential poll on Monday, those from Uttar Pradesh will have the maximum vote value among MLAs, while the vote value of those from Sikkim is the lowest.

Members of Parliament have a much higher vote value at 700. The vote value of each of the 403 MLAs of Uttar Pradesh is 208, which pegs the cumulative value at 83,824. Each MLA of Tamil Nadu and Jharkhand has a vote value of 176 followed by that of Maharashtra (175), Bihar (173), Andhra Pradesh (159).

The cumulative vote value of the 234-member Tamil Nadu assembly is 41,184 and that of 81-member Jharkhand is 14,256. The value of the 288-member Maharashtra assembly is 50,400 and 243-member Bihar house is 42,039 and 175-member Andhra Pradesh assembly is 27,825.

The vote value of an MLA is calculated on the basis of the total population of the state,

based on the 1971 census.

Among smaller states, the vote value of each MLA of Sikkim is 7, followed by Arunachal Pradesh and Mizoram (8 each), Nagaland (9), Meghalaya (17), Manipur (18) and Goa (20). The

value of an MLA of the Union Territory of Puducherry is 16.

The vote value of 72-member Sikkim assembly is 224, 40-member Mizoram assembly is 320, 60-member assembly of Arunachal Pradesh is 480, 60-member Nagaland assembly is 540, 60-member Meghalaya house is 1020, 60-member Manipur assembly is 1,080 and 40-member Goa assembly is 800.

The value of the vote of a Member of Parliament was reduced to 700 from 708 due to the absence of a legislative assembly in Jammu and Kashmir.

The value of the vote of an MP in a presidential election is based on the number of

elected members in legislative assemblies of states and union territories, including Delhi, Puducherry and Jammu and Kashmir.

The Electoral College for the presidential election comprises the members of Lok Sabha, Rajya Sabha and those of the legislative assemblies of states and union territories including Delhi, Puducherry and Jammu and Kashmir. — PTI

24 Bills to be introduced in monsoon session

NEW DELHI, July 16: As many as 24 new Bills will be introduced in the upcoming monsoon session of Parliament, including Press and Registration of Periodicals Bill, 2022.

"The Bill seeks to replace the Press and Registration of Books (PRB) Act, 1867 by decriminalisation of the existing Act, keeping the procedures of the extant Act simple from the viewpoint of medium/small publishers and uphold the values of Press Freedom".

The Bill may see stiff opposition as it is said that this Bill is being brought to control the small publishers and digital media. The Opposition has already alleged that the government is trying to stifle voice of dissent in the country.

Another important Bill is the Energy Conservation (Amendment) Bill, 2022, which seeks to provide regulatory framework for Carbon Trading in India, to encourage penetration of renewables in energy mix, and effective implementation and enforcement of the Energy Conservation Act.

Four other Bills have been referred to the standing committee: the Wild Life (Protection) Amendment Bill, 2021; the Anti-Maritime Piracy Bill, 2019; the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens (Amendment) Bill, 2019; and the National Anti-Doping Bill, 2021.

The one Bill which has been introduced in the Lok Sabha but not sent to standing committee is the Indian Antarctic Bill, 2022.

The Congress has raised the issue of "unparliamentary" words and Jairam Ramesh had said: "Clarification from @ombirlakota about unparliamentary words doesn't mean much. In all discussions, media seems to have overlooked that they can't report on these comments in their dispatches. Also, print media will have to think twice before using these words in their articles." — IANS

LS Speaker holds all-party meet; Opp seeks Agnipath debate

NEW DELHI, July 16: Ahead of the monsoon session of Parliament, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla on Saturday sought cooperation of all parties for smooth conduct of proceedings with "decency, dignity and discipline", even as the Opposition demanded discussion on the Agnipath scheme, unemployment and farmers' issues.

At an all-party meeting ahead of the session beginning on Monday, Birla informed the leaders about preparations for the session.

He later said that leaders of all parties assured that they will cooperate in conducting the proceedings of the House with dignity.

Several opposition political parties — TMC, TRS, Shiv Sena, NCP, BSP, SP, TDP, SAD and Left parties — skipped the meeting. The BJD was also had no representation.

However, Congress and its allies DMK and IUML attended the meeting. While Congress was represented by Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury, TR

Baalu from DMK participated. Leaders from YSR Congress and NDA's constituents — LJP, Apna Dal were also present in the meeting.

The government was represented by Union Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi and Minister of State in the same ministry Arjun Ram Meghwal.

In a tweet after the meeting, the Speaker said he urged all parties to "cooperate in the smooth conduct of the proceedings with decency, dignity and discipline in accordance with the high traditions and values of the House".

He further said that efforts will be made to have extensive discussion and dialogue on topics related to public interest.

Issues, such as the recently issued list of unparliamentary words, are also believed to have come up for discussion in the meeting.

The Speaker holds this customary all-party meeting before the start of every Parliament session.

The monsoon session of the Parliament will begin on July 18 and is scheduled to continue till August 12.

Congress leader in Lok Sabha Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury said the Opposition demanded a discussion on the Agnipath military recruitment scheme, unemployment and farmers' issues in the upcoming monsoon session.

Baalu also demanded discussion on these issues.

Birla also informed the members there will be 18 sittings during the session and a total time of 108 hours will be available out of which about 62 hours will be for government business.

The remaining time has been allotted for Question Hour, Zero Hour and private members' business, Birla was quoted in a statement issued by the Lok Sabha Secretariat.

Birla also informed that like previous sessions, proper Covid-19 protocol will be followed in this session and adequate arrangements have been made in this regard. — PTI

AAP to support Yashwant Sinha in presidential poll



NEW DELHI, July 16: Aam Admi Party will support joint opposition candidate Yashwant Sinha in the presidential poll. The presidential poll is scheduled to be held on July 18 as the tenure of President Ram Nath Kovind ends on July 24.

The decision was taken in a meeting of the party's topmost national-level body, Political Affairs Committee, held at Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's residence on Saturday.

"AAP will support opposition's presidential candidate Yashwant Sinha. We respect Droupadi

Murmu but we will vote for Yashwant Sinha," said AAP Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh.

"The party's Political Affairs Committee meeting was held under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and unanimously decided that the party will support opposition candidate Yashwant Sinha," Singh said.

He said that Droupadi Murmu is the candidate of the ruling party and they respect her but in the election they will support Yashwant Sinha, the opposition candidate. The party's MLAs and MPs will vote for Sinha, he added.

With Bhagwant Mann becoming the Chief Minister of Punjab after AAP swept the Assembly polls, the party's number in the Lok Sabha has been reduced to zero. However, AAP has 10 members in the Upper House, along with 62 MLAs in Delhi and 92 in Punjab. — IANS

ITBP jawan shoots 3 colleagues, kills self

JAMMU, July 16: An Indo-Tibetan Border Police jawan on Saturday fired at his three colleagues before shooting himself dead at a camp in Udhampur district of Jammu and Kashmir, officials said.

The incident took place around 3:30 pm at the Devika Ghat community centre in the district. Constable Bhupendra Singh shot at his colleagues, leading to bullet injuries to a head constable and two constables, a senior ITBP officer said. The injured have been admitted to a hospital, and are out of danger, he said.

Singh later shot himself from his INSAS service rifle and he died on the spot, the officer said.

The jawan belonged to the 8th battalion of the force and was presently deputed to the 'I' company of the 2nd ad-hoc

battalion of the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) deployed in Jammu and Kashmir for security duties.

Preliminary inputs suggest some altercation took place between the jawans, but the exact cause that led to the incident is still being probed, the official said.

A court of inquiry has been ordered by the border guarding force, he said. The ITBP is primarily tasked to guard the 3,488 km-long Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China apart from rendering a variety of roles in the internal security domain of the country.

The incident comes a day after an Army jawan shot himself fatally after killing another colleague and injuring two others in Poonch district of the union territory. — PTI

Galgotias University Law School ranks 3rd in survey

GUWAHATI, July 16: Constantly setting new benchmarks in academic excellence, Galgotias University (Greater Noida), has added another feather in its cap. This time it was by its Law School, which has brought laurels to the institute by achieving a remarkable feat.

The university's Law School has been ranked third (with 250.4 marks) among all government and private educational institutions in India in a survey published by India Today-MDRA this month, stat-

ed a press release.

National Law School of India University, Bengaluru has achieved the first position (259.6 points) in the survey.

Chancellor of Galgotias University Sunil Galgotia said, "The success of the university has proved once again about our focus on academic excellence, research and placements. This enables the students here not only in getting better placements on attractive packages, but it also helps our students to make a mark in India as well as abroad."

Shinde govt nod to renaming of Aurangabad, Osmanabad

MUMBAI, July 16: The Eknath Shinde-led government in Maharashtra on Saturday gave a cabinet approval to rename Aurangabad and Osmanabad cities as Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar and Dharashiv respectively.

The decision to rename these cities was taken in the previous Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government's last Cabinet meeting chaired by the then chief minister Uddhav Thackeray on June 29, just before he resigned.

However, Shinde and Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis, who were sworn in on June 30, had said the Thackeray-led dispensation's decision to rename these places

was illegal as it was taken by it after the governor had asked it to prove majority in the state Legislative Assembly.

During the Cabinet meeting chaired by Thackeray last month, Aurangabad was renamed as Sambhajanagar, but the Shinde government on Saturday added 'Chhatrapati' prefix to it.

At present, Shinde and Fadnis are the only two members in the Cabinet as its expansion is still pending.

A statement from the Chief Minister's Office said the minutes of the June 29 Cabinet meeting (chaired by Thackeray) were approved by the new government (led by Shinde) at the Cabinet meet-

ing held on Saturday.

The minutes of the meeting had come for approval before the new government, which had directed the administration to re-submit the proposal, it said.

"The fresh proposal approved by the Cabinet today will be sent to the Centre, after which the renaming of both the cities will be done at the divisional, district, taluka, municipal corporation and council levels," it said.

The Cabinet also approved the decision to name the proposed Navi Mumbai International Airport after farmer leader DB Patil. This decision was also taken in the Thackeray-led Cabinet last month. — PTI

His last rites would be performed at the Nabagraha crematorium on July 18.

AIPC flays Centre for imposing GST on foodgrains

GUWAHATI, July 16: The Assam unit of the All India Professionals' Congress (AIPC) has come down heavily on the BJP-led Central government for imposing five per cent GST on rice, wheat, pulses and other foodgrains.

Criticising the government's decision in strong words, AIPC State president Gaurav Somani asked the Central government to roll back its decision and the GST Council to review its decision of imposing GST on foodgrains.

It is to be noted that the GST will apply on foodgrains from July 18. This will raise the prices of rice, jowar, ragi,

cereals etc., which is going to impact the poor, middle and labour class of the society.

"Due to inflation, the middle and poor class have no capacity to cope with price rise in the most-needed foodgrains used to prepare food," said Somani in a statement.

"Foodgrains like rice, wheat, pulses and others were exempted from tax since 1983 considering that they are used widely by people. After GST, a quintal of rice will cost Rs 300 to Rs 400 more. The prices of ragi, pulses and jowar will also rise," he added.

The government has already imposed GST on pre-packed labelled curd, butter milk and *lassi*, which were outside the ambit of GST so

far. These are items of mass consumption sold at local *kirana* stores, he further said.

"Prices of grains and pulses may rise by 8-10 per cent and not just 5 per cent. Small shopkeepers will have to bear compliance costs of hiring experts to file returns and pay service charges once they obtain a GST number. They will lose out to retail chains," he said.

"Food brands like Amul and Nestle have announced price hike in their food products after July 18. Curd, butter milk and *lassi* are consumed by the common man. Small vendors will now have to hire experts to file monthly GST returns and they may wonder if it's worth the trouble and the expense," he added.

"The fire began in a house in front of Udayachal High School. The cause of the fire is yet to be ascertained. However, it is believed that the fire broke out due to an LPG cooking cylinder burst. Altogether five cylinders burst in the fire. Three families used to stay in the house," he said.

Five fire tenders were pressed to douse the fire. It took the fire officials around two hours to control the blaze. — City Correspondent

Botanical garden coming up at Old Jail premises

GUWAHATI, July 16: The Guwahati Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has been working on an ambitious project of a botanical garden at the Old Jail premises at Fancy Bazar at a cost of around Rs 36 crore.



The project will be completed by December this year. A Delhi-based architectural firm M/s Creator Architects is the consulting agency for the entire project.

After completion of the project, the city will have a unique botanical garden which will become a landmark for the entire Northeast and the people of Guwahati will get a much-needed breathing space in the busy Fancy Bazar area.

The botanical garden will come up in 41.21 bighas of land, having a lotus pond covering 1.25 bighas of land and the pond at the south side of the Old Jail covering 6.25 bighas of land.

The GMDA has also left two bighas of land for road widening on the MS Road and Jail Road and the hawkers' zone towards the boundary wall on the Ke-

dar Road side.

There will be two main gates for entry and exit to the botanical garden complex – one from the Jail Road side and the other from the Kedar Road side.

No roadside parking will be allowed around the botanical garden complex.

Moreover, two rotary points (like the

area attached with an amphitheatre near the Jail Road and Kedar Road junction. The existing south pond will be renovated for use as a recreational area with different activities. There will also be sufficient sets of public toilets within and outside the complex.

Apart from the botanical garden, a 12.54 bigha of land within the old jail premises has been earmarked in the master plan to be utilised mainly for a multi-level ramp type car parking having commercial spaces also from revenue earning point of view.

However, of the 12.54 bighas of land earmarked for future expansion, an area of 2.95 bighas has already been handed over to the Guwahati Municipal Corporation (GMC) for setting up of a waste disposal plant.

As advised by the Principal Secretary, Department of Housing and Urban Affairs during his visit to the site in the month of February 2022 along with the Chairman and CEO of GMDA, JN Khanatani, the senior consultant engineer and also senior technical advisor GMDA had prepared an advance and preliminary concepts proposal and submitted a proposal of a ground plus 10 floors building complex to accommodate 42 per cent commercial units and 58 per cent parking in each floor to be used as car parking area with independent ramp type circulation for entry and exit from the building complex.

The facility will provide car parking space for as many as 1116 cars. The estimated cost of the entire building complex will be around Rs 252.47 crore. The multi-level ramp type car parking will be a source of revenue earning for the GMDA which can be used by it for maintaining the botanical garden.

On this matter, neither the college governing body nor the principal of the college had felt the need to discuss the latest status of the institution with its stakeholders like Alumni Association, union body, eminent citizens and members of local public representatives. The union therefore urged the principal to take necessary steps in this regard.

Cops in plain clothes deployed in Jorhat for crime prevention

JORHAT, July 16: The Superintendent of Police here has deployed police personnel in plain clothes across the town to keep a close watch on activities and to take prompt action against any kind of crime.

In an interaction with newspersons at his office chamber on Friday evening, the SP said that as part of the action initiated to prevent anti-social elements from creating trouble,

cops in plain clothes had been deployed for patrolling in vulnerable areas of the town.

"Rider parties in motorbikes and other patrolling teams are supporting the men in civil dress," Meena stated.

Replying to a query over defunct CCTVs installed a few years back, the SP said that he had taken an initiative to instal a large number of high-resolution cameras in strategic points of the town as well as highways and bypass by requesting the

Plea to compensate Tihu flood victims

TIHU, July 16: The ill-fated family members of Mathur Sarma, Promod Sarma and Gakul Sarma of village Bali in Nalbari district are putting up in rented houses after leaving their dwelling houses near river Marapagaldia as the floodwaters destroyed all their personal belongings.

Mathur Sarma and his four-member family are at present living in a rented house at Tihu while Promod Sarma and his wife are living at Tarun Bhagwati's residence in the village while Gakul Sarma and his two-member family are taking refuge at Dipmani Sarma's residence near Bali Vidyapith HS School.

Gakul Sarma earns his living by priesthood while Promod Sarma and his wife earn their daily bread by working in other people's houses. As is evident, they hail from very poor families.

Meanwhile, the floodwaters breached the Haribhanga-Bali-Kaithalkuchi PWD road at Bali. As a result, the strong water current flowed through their houses and carved a huge hollow depression in their courtyards and washed away all their household belongings.

Mathur Sarma, a senior citizen and a diabetes patient said, "We three families are not in a position to resettle at our original hearths as the floodwaters have already damaged our dwelling houses. Besides, more waves of flood are yet to come, as in the previous years." It may be pertinent to mention here that there is no room to construct an embankment between the river and their residences.

As floodwaters of the Marapagaldia caused heavy damage to these three families, hence they were forced to leave their dwellings. The district administration and the government should look into the plight of these flood victims and compensate them appropriately, the local people opined.

Refurbished tax dept in KAAC becomes major revenue earner

DIPHU, July 16: The taxation sector of Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC) received a major boost while a number of public and private industries and commercial sector organisations have started paying the compulsory tax levied on them by the Council authority for the very first time.

The taxation sector of Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council which was in a ramshackle condition until last year has been revamped as a major revenue-earning de-

partment of the Council, surpassing the traditional Forest, Transportation and Excise departments, within this short period.

Tuliram Ronghang, Chief Executive Member (CEM) of Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council placed this department under the disposal of the secretary to CEM and his trusted ally Mukul Kathar last year.

The refurbished taxation department is contemplating to collect more than Rs 100 crore annual revenue. The tax sector has gone through complete overhauling, thereby adding potential taxpayers af-

Key players in the telecom, power, transportation and excise sectors that can levy tax on certain goods or production that have been granted licence by the Council authority, have started paying duty and levy to the Council authority.

Reliance Jio phone cleared its due of Rs 31 lakh to the Council recently, while Bharti Airtel Limited and other sectors like BSNL, Assam Power Distribution Co. Limited, OIL etc., have started negotiation with the Council to fix the nitty-gritty of its tax particulars.

Today is World Snake Day and we are thankful to Cachar DFO Tejas Mariswamy for the support and also to the villagers who helped us rescue the snake."

Woman sent to judicial custody for lodging false FIR

HAILAKANDI, July 16: In a landmark order on July 15, a lady has been sent to judicial custody by the Additional Sessions Judge here for lodging a false FIR alleging rape committed on her. This is probably a precedent and this sort of punishment will deter the people who lodge false complaints and misuse police and judiciary to settle personal enmity, said a senior police official.

As per the order of the Additional Sessions Judge, the complainant was taken into custody with the intimation to her father apprehending the fact that she may evade the process of law and was produced before the

Chief Judicial Magistrate. A case was also registered against her under sections 193 and 195 IPC for giving false evidence/declaration before the court.

It may be mentioned here that the lady in her FIR stated that the accused person "raped her" and for which the case was registered under section 448 and 376 IPC.

Court stated that she gave false evidence and the accused prayed for initiating a proceeding against the complainant lady as "she was having a grudge out of a land dispute".

Court in its order observed that the "offence of rape is serious in nature. Whenever any such incident is reported, human-

ity as a whole starts raising protest against such barbarous act and the society demands severe punishment against the wrong doers. Sometimes, it is felt that some false cases are also filed and for which, the lives of many male persons get spoiled. Court of law is established to deliver justice to the person whose rights have been infringed."

"The court or police authorities can't be used as a tool of oppression to others. Justice demands that whoever abuses the process of law should also get a lesson so that the similar minded person in the society would be deterred from such acts in future," the order further said.

Patna terror module has Pak connection: Police

PATNA, July 16: Days after the Patna police and the National Investigation Agency (NIA) busted an anti-national group in Phulwari Sharif area of Patna, the investigation has revealed that it has terror links in Pakistan and Bangladesh.

The joint team has arrested seven alleged members of the extremist group – Popular Front of India (PFI) – till now and one of them, Marguv Ahmed Danish alias Tahir, was

in contact with youths in Pakistan and Bangladesh.

"Marguv had formed a Whatsapp group named 'Ghazwa-e-Hind' wherein a number of youths of Pakistan and Bangladesh were associated with," said Patna Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Manavjeet Singh Dhillon.

"Marguv, a native of Bihar's Gaya district had completed the course of Hafiz Bastania and Fokania. He is said to be a

radicalised person who was in contact with Pakistani youths through Whatsapp, Facebook and e-mail since 2016. During investigation, Marguv was involved in uploading and passing provocative audio and video content on social networking platforms and his Whatsapp group 'Ghazwa-E-Hind'. He was also associated with a Pakistani group 'Tahriq-e-Labbaik'. A Pakistani national named Faizan is also in regular

contact with him," the SSP added.

Marguv is a resident of Isapur Canal locality under Phulwari Sharif police station. An FIR was also registered in the Phulwari Sharif police station. The joint team of Patna ATS and the NIA conducted raids at Sabji Bagh locality on Friday and recovered objectionable material from the offices of PFI.

The joint team has arrested

seven persons till now, including Marguv. The other accused have been identified as Mohammad Jalaluddin, retired sub-inspector of Jharkhand Athar Parvez, Shamim Akhtar, Arman Malik, Tahir Ahmed and Shabbir Malik.

The Patna police registered an FIR against 26 persons in connection with this case and 19 of them are currently absconding. — IANS

Daler Mehndi, Sidhu share same barrack in Patiala jail

CHANDIGARH, July 16: Punjabi pop singer Daler Mehndi and Congress leader and former cricketer-turned-politician Navjot Sidhu are in the same barrack in the Patiala Central Jail in Punjab.

The other high-profile politician in the jail is Shiromani Akali Dal leader Bikram Singh Majithia, the brother-in-law of MP Sukhbir Badal.

A Patiala district court on Thursday upheld the two-year jail term of Mehndi, who in 2018 was sentenced for a 2003 human trafficking case.

Mehndi has been kept in

barrack number 10 where Sidhu is also undergoing his sentence, a jail official said, requesting anonymity.

Majithia has been lodged in the neighbouring barrack in a drugs case registered against him in December last year.

Jail officials said while Mehndi and Majithia are not having a special diet or home-cooked food, Sidhu, who was sentenced to one-year in prison by the Supreme Court in a road rage case of 1988 in which a 65-year-old man was killed, is having a special diet as recommended by the medical

board owing to his medical conditions.

Sidhu's high fibre and low fat diet mainly comprises fruits and vegetables. The meal is cooked without desi ghee, butter or any other saturated fatty oils.

Former state Congress chief Sidhu on May 20 surrendered before a court in his hometown Patiala in the road rage case in which the apex court enhanced his punishment to a year's rigorous imprisonment.

All high-profile have been lodged in ordinary barracks as the AAP government has de-

cided to junk special cells in jails for VIP prisoners across the state.

Majithia, one of the most powerful SAD leaders, is often complaining of insecure and poor living conditions in the jail.

Both Sidhu and Majithia were once close friends but are now political enemies.

They were in fray from Amritsar East in the recently held Assembly polls and the seat witnessed a bitter battle. They were defeated by AAP's greenhorn Jeevan Jyot Kaur. — IANS

NEW DELHI, July 16: The contractor and the supervisor of the construction site where five people were killed in a wall collapse have been arrested, a Delhi Police official said on Saturday.

The accused were identified as contractor Sikander and supervisor Satish. The third accused Shakti Singh is still at large, the official said.

In the incident, which took place at Bakoli village, near Chauhan Dharamkanta in the Narela area on Friday afternoon, five labourers were

killed and nine others sustained injuries when an under-construction warehouse's boundary wall, which was approximately 100 feet long and 15 feet high, collapsed on them.

The labourers were digging a foundation, just adjacent to the wall, and were buried under the debris.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal have expressed grief over the loss of lives.

Police have registered an FIR under Sections 288 (Negligent conduct with respect to pulling down or repairing buildings), 337 (Causing hurt by act endangering life or personal safety of others), 338 (Causing grievous hurt by act endangering life or personal safety of others), 304 (Punishment for culpable homicide not amounting to murder) and 34 (common intention) of the Indian Penal Code at the Alipur police station. — IANS

Cong to protest outside ED's Jaipur office on July 21

JAIPUR, July 16: The Congress on Saturday said its workers and office-bearers will protest outside the Enforcement Directorate's office here on July 21 against the agency's summons to party president Sonia Gandhi.

Rajasthan Congress president Govind Singh Dotasra made the announcement during a meeting of party office-bearers.

The ED has asked Gandhi to depose before it on July 21 for questioning in the *National Herald* newspaper-linked money-laundering case.

Gandhi (75) was first issued the notice for appearance on June 8, but

after she tested positive for Covid, the summons for June 23 was issued. She could not keep the second date as well because she was "strictly advised to rest at home following her hospitalisation on account of Covid-19 and a lung infection".

Dotasra said the Congress will hold a protest outside the ED office here on July 21 against the agency's questioning of Gandhi in the *National Herald* case, which is pending in court.

The Congress will also hold protests against Gandhi's questioning across district headquarters in Rajasthan on July 22, a party spokesperson said. — PTI

Nagaland Chief Secy for improving ease of doing business

The Motor Vehicles Department, in its presentation, gave an overview of its administrative set-up, activities, vision and ongoing projects.

Panel urges Modi, Shah to invite NSCN (I-M) leaders

DIMAPUR, July 16: Nagaland's Parliamentary Committee on the Naga Political Issue today urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah to invite NSCN (I-M) leaders for final resolution of the Naga issue as the talks had concluded officially on October 31, 2019.

The committee also urged the negotiating parties to refer to the competencies as reflected in the Framework Agreement of August 3, 2015, signed between the Government of India and the NSCN (I-M), to arrive at a mutually acceptable "definition of competencies" to resolve the contentious issue at the earliest and bring about a final solution that is honourable, acceptable and inclusive.

Adopting a four-point resolution at a meeting in Kohima, the committee welcomed the positive initiatives being taken by the Government of India and the working committee of the Naga National Political Groups (NNPGs) on the ongoing peace dialogue, a release

issued by Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio, Deputy Chief Minister Y Patton, United Democratic Alliance chairman TR Zeliang, and Naga People's Front Legislature Party leader Kuzholuzo Nienu said. It also welcomed the efforts made by the Naga political groups in taking the talks forward.

While welcoming the statements and observations made by various organisa-

tions and individuals calling for unity and early solution, the parliamentary committee appealed to all sections to refrain from making statements that may create misunderstanding and disunity and may stand in the way of "our common and collective endeavour" to achieve genuine and lasting peace.

Stating that it is not a party to the Naga political negotiations, the parliamentary committee said it is playing the role of a facilitator, representing and reflecting the voice of the people. "This role will continue to be pursued in a serious manner," it said.

"We stand by the commitments of the constituent political parties as reflected in their respective manifestos to pave the way in the event of a political solution being arrived at," the release added.

One more body recovered from Noney landslide site

IMPHAL, July 16: The death toll in the Noney district landslide rose to 55 after one more body was recovered during the ongoing search operation, which entered the 17th day on Saturday, officials said. Six other victims are still missing.

The landslide hit a railway construction camp at Marangching Part 5 village on June 29. It also affected camps of Territorial Army personnel deployed in the area.

A senior State Government official, who is monitoring the situation in Noney, said over phone that the search would continue. A review meeting which was scheduled for Saturday, has been postponed till Monday.

Heroin seized, 2 held

DIMAPUR, July 16: The Nagaland Police seized 143 grams of heroin from a vehicle plying on the National Highway 2 in Kohima today and arrested two persons in this connection.

The SP (Crime) and the PRO, Police Headquarters, Kohima, stated in a release that following a tip-off, narcotics cell personnel intercepted a Guwahati-bound vehicle (AS 01AX-4348) on the highway which was proceeding from Lilong village in Thoubal district of Manipur.

On thorough search of the vehicle, the heroin concealed in 11 soap cases was recovered, the release added.

The police seized the contraband and arrested the two occupants of the vehicle - one Md Maniqur Rahman (25) and Md Warish (25) of Lilong village of Thoubal district.

A case under Section 21 (c)/60 of the NDPS Act has been registered, the release stated.

Top officials of Jorhat, Mokokchung dists discuss border issues

JORHAT, July 16: Top officials of Jorhat and Mokokchung (Nagaland) districts today held discussions on several issues including border encroachment, at Tuli in Mokokchung district.

The Jorhat district administration team was led by Jorhat DC Ashok Kumar Barman, along with SP Mohan Lal Meena. It included DFO Nandha Kumar and Additional DC Damodar Barman among others.

The Nagaland delegation was led by Mokokchung DC Shashank Pratap Singh, SP Aotula T Imchen, DFO Sen-

titula Pongen and other officials. The Jorhat DC said that the coordination meeting was held to discuss issues relating to both the districts including boundary matters.

Barman said that his side raised the issue of reported encroachment on certain areas along the border, by Nagaland. Stating that the talks were held in a cordial manner, the DC said that the Nagaland side assured to look into the issue.

Barman said that both sides agreed on maintaining peace and tranquillity along the border and strengthen coordination to prevent criminal activities. He added that both

sides also agreed to promote good relations among the residents living on either side of the border.

There have been recent reports about encroachment activities by miscreants in areas within Jorhat district like burning of forest patches, destruction of tea bushes, and installation of signboards, reportedly by a Nagaland students' body, claiming ownership of territory.

Jorhat district shares a 101-km border with Nagaland, out of which the maximum area is with Mokokchung and the remaining with Wokha.

Earlier, tension had erupted in the border areas

of Jorhat within the Mariani Revenue Circle following which forest and police camps were set up by both the States. An agreement between the Chief Secretaries of both the States was signed on July 31, 2021, at Chumekedima in Nagaland, to take steps including withdrawal of the camps and easing tension.

It may be mentioned here that due to the decades-old inter-State border row, incidents of alleged encroachment by the Nagaland side - at times leading to violence - have resulted in border flare-ups on a number of previous occasions.

BJP sweeps Panchayat bypolls in Arunachal

ITANAGAR, July 16: The ruling BJP in Arunachal Pradesh has swept the Panchayat by-elections by securing over 80 per cent of the Gram Panchayat (GP) seats. The State Election Commission (SEC) today declared the results of the recently held rural body polls, official sources said.

Significantly, candidates in 116 out of the total 130 seats of GP member were elected unopposed, while elections were held for one Zilla Parishad (ZP) constituency and 14 remaining GP seats.

Of the 116 GP seats in which the candidates were declared elected without contest, the saffron party bagged 101 of them, followed by Independents who clinched 10 of these seats. The Congress and the National People's Party (NPP) won two seats each, and the Janata Dal (United) one.

A total of 31 candidates were in the fray for the remaining 14 GP seats and the lone ZP seat (Upper Koloriang in Kurung Kumey district), SEC Secretary Nyalie Ete said.

Ete said that the polling held on July 12 was "by and large peaceful" barring a stray incident at 4/5 Tayeng polling station under 4-Upper Koloriang ZP constituency which necessitated a fresh poll on July 14. The polling percentage for the ZP constituency and the GP seats stood at 84.55 and 88.28 respectively.

The counting of votes took place on Saturday. The lone ZP seat was won by Independent candidate Bengia Riyal, who defeated his NPP rival, Chello

Tagar, by 98 votes.

The BJP won seven of the GP seats, the NPP three, the JD(U) two, and the Congress won one seat, in which elections were held. One seat went to an Independent candidate.

With the victory today, the BJP has won a total of 108 seats in the rural polls. The NPP secured five seats, while the Congress and the JD(U) won three each. Eleven seats were bagged by Independents, as per figures released by the SEC.

The by-elections were necessitated due to multiple factors including rejection of nomination papers, non-availability of eligible candidates, law-and-order issues, disqualification of elected members under the anti-defection law, and death and resignation of members who were elected in the general elections in 2020.

Earlier, a special summary revision of the electoral rolls of the Panchayat constituencies concerned was carried out. The final electoral rolls were published on May 30.

Meanwhile, State Election Commissioner Hage Kojeen has congratulated all the winners of the Panchayat bypolls and conveyed his appreciation to the district electoral machinery such as DEOs, ROs, observers, and others for the 'successful' conduct of the by-elections.

In the general elections to the two-tier Panchayat bodies held in December, 2020, the BJP won 188 out of the 242 ZP seats and 6,270 of the 8,216 GP seats. The Independents came second by securing 23 ZP and 1,035 GP seats, while the Congress bagged just nine ZP and 375 GP seats.

Centre pulls up edtech firms for mis-selling courses

NEW DELHI, July 16: After the Centre took serious note of mis-selling of courses to parents by edtech firms including BYJU's and its group companies, self-regulatory organisation India Edtech Consortium (IEC) on Saturday said it is committed to protecting consumer interest and has resolved 100 per cent complaints received till June.

The Ministry of Consumer Affairs pulled up edtech firms during a meeting with them and IEC, according to sources, and aggressive mis-selling of courses to parents was the key concern.

The IEC, which comes under the aegis of the Internet and Mobile Association of India (IAMAI) and has created a two-tier grievance redressal mechanism, said that it has resolved all complaints received until June 2022 complaints received in July were going through active screening for faster resolutions.

"The edtech sector is extremely dynamic in nature and therefore, to address the rising challenges, what IEC is proactively doing will certainly propel a stronger ecosystem in the coming times," said ret'd SC judge and chairperson of Independent Grievance Redressal Board, Dr BS Chauhan.

The IEC also said that each member company has appointed a dedicated grievance officer internally to address and assess the problem and offer remedial action accordingly.

The IEC-member companies are also registering at the National Consumer Helpline for streamlining the resolution process, it added.

"Edtech as a strong community has been far more responsible and prompt than our traditional counterpart in managing consumer complaints and grievances," said Mayank Kumar, UpGrad Co-founder and MD and Chair at IEC. - IANS

Tesla will lower price for cars if inflation calms down: Musk

SAN FRANCISCO, July 16: Tesla CEO Elon Musk said that his electric vehicle company Tesla would pull down the prices of its car if the inflation calmed down.

On the microblogging site Twitter, the tech honcho mentioned the car prices on being asked by a user if the company plans to down the cost of cars after the pandemic or supply chain matters.

"If inflation calms down, we can lower prices for cars," the tech billionaire wrote on Twitter.

Last month, Musk-owned Tesla once again increased the prices of its electric cars across its entire lineup, with some models going up by as much as \$6,000.

After a year of increasing prices almost every month in 2021, Tesla slowed down the rapid rise in prices across its electric vehicles in early 2022. - IANS

Bank unions to start Twitter campaign against privatisation

CHENNAI, July 16: A day ahead of the start of the Parliament's Monsoon session, the United Forum of Bank Unions (UFBU) has given a call for a campaign on Twitter against privatisation of government banks, a top union official said.

All India Bank Employees' Association (AIBE) General Secretary CH Venkatachalam also said a protest will be held before the Parliament on July 21 and a strike call will be given based on the developments during the session.

The monsoon session of the Parlia-

ment begins on July 18 and one of the Bills that may be brought is to enable privatisation of the government banks.

"The Twitter campaign by the bankers will begin on Sunday, the morning of July 17. During these days, campaigning through social media is also important apart from our traditional campaigning mode," Venkatachalam said.

He had told the union members to tweet in English and also in the regional languages to reach a large number of people.

For a long time, it has been said time

has come to merge the government banks to have about five big banks.

Recently, in a paper, Poonam Gupta of National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER) and Arvind Panagariya of Columbia University had advocated privatisation of all government banks barring the State Bank of India (SBI).

They had said, to start with two banks with better asset quality and higher returns be privatised and set them as an example for disinvestment by the government in its other banks. - IANS

RBI, Bank Indonesia agree to expand cooperation in payment systems

MUMBAI, July 16: The Reserve Bank of India and Bank Indonesia on Saturday entered into an agreement to expand cooperation in payment systems, digital financial innovation, and anti-money laundering and combating the financing of terrorism (AML-CFT).

The two central banks signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in Bali on the sidelines of the G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors Meeting to improve mutual cooperation.

"With this MoU, RBI and BI committed to deepen re-

lations between both central banks and strengthen the exchange of information and co-operation in the area of central banking, including payment systems, digital innovation in payments services, and regulatory and supervisory framework for AML-CFT," the RBI said in a statement.

The MoU will be implemented through policy dialogue, technical cooperation, exchange of information and joint work.

It was signed by RBI Deputy Governor Michael Debabrata Patra and BI Deputy Governor Dody Budi Waluyo

in the presence of RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das and BI Governor Perry Warjiyo.

"This MoU serves as a significant milestone in the relation between Bank Indonesia and Reserve Bank of India. It has been a long period of time since we began cooperating productively, and this MoU will only ensure a more solid collaboration in the future.

"Going forward, I am convinced that such excellent partnership will result in fruitful outcomes that benefit both central banks and the people of both nations," Governor Warjiyo said.

RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das noted that "this MoU is a step forward in putting our joint efforts within a formal mechanism."

He also expressed the hope that "going ahead, the MoU will enable us to further deepen our relations and facilitate our endeavour to make our financial systems accessible, inclusive and secure."

The RBI further said the MoU will also provide a good basis for promoting mutual understanding, developing efficient payment systems and achieving cross-border payment connectivity. - PTI

Meta platforms in India found exposed to human rights risks due to 3rd party action

NEW DELHI, July 16: Meta platforms, which include Facebook and WhatsApp, were found exposed to human rights risks such as "restrictions of freedom of expression and information" and "hatred that incites hostility" due to action of third parties, the first human rights report of the social media giant has said.

The report is based on an independent human rights impact assessment (HRIA) commissioned in 2019 by

Meta on potential human rights risks in India and other countries related to its platforms.

The project was undertaken by Foley Hoag LLP.

"The HRIA noted the potential for Meta's platforms to be connected to salient human rights risks caused by third parties, including: restrictions of freedom of expression and information; third party advocacy of hatred that incites hostility, discrimination, or violence; rights to non-discrimination;

as well as violations of rights to privacy and security of person," the report said.

The HRIA involved interviews with 40 civil society stakeholders, academics, and journalists.

The report found that Meta faced criticism and potential reputational risks related to risks of hateful or discriminatory speech by end users.

The assessment also noted a difference between company and external stakeholder understandings of

content policies.

"It noted persistent challenges relating to user education; difficulties of reporting and reviewing content; and challenges of enforcing content policies across different languages. In addition, the assessors noted that civil society stakeholders raised several allegations of bias in content moderation. The assessors did not assess or reach conclusions about whether such bias existed," the report said. - PTI

DEC to construct executive enclave under Central Vista Project

NEW DELHI, July 16: DEC Infrastructure has come out as the lowest bidder for the construction of the Executive Enclave under the Centre's ambitious Central Vista Project.

The Executive Enclave comprises the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), the Cabinet Secretariat, the India House and the National Security Council Secretariat.

The Central Public Works Department (CPWD) has been executing the Modi government's ambitious Central Vista Redevelopment project. Officials said that Hyderabad-based DEC Infrastructure and Projects (India) Private Limited had quoted an amount of around Rs 1,189 crore, 10.44 per cent less than the Rs 1,328 crore cost estimated by the CPWD. The estimated cost also includes maintenance and housekeeping for five years.

Construction of the new Parliament is in full swing and Tata Projects Limited is executing the project. Tata Projects limited had quoted Rs 1,407 crore while Larsen and Toubro Limited had quoted a bid amount of around Rs 1,424 crore.

The India House will be used as a conference facility like the Hyderabad House where high-level talks, especially with top visiting leaders of various countries, are currently held.

Shapoorji Pallonji and Company Limited is executing the redevelopment work of the Central Vista Avenue stretching from Vijay Chowk to India Gate.

The redevelopment of the Central Vista in New Delhi comprises a new Parliament building, a common Central Secretariat, revamping of the three-kilometre Rajpath from the Rashtrapati Bhavan to India Gate, a new office and residence of the prime minister, and a new vice-president's enclave. - IANS

HDFC Bank's Q1 profit up to Rs 9,196 crore

MUMBAI, July 16: Private banking major HDFC Bank Ltd closed the first quarter of FY23 with a net profit of Rs 9,196 crore.

According to HDFC Bank, its net profit for the period under review grew to Rs 9,196 crore from about Rs 7,729 crore earned during the first quarter ended June 30, 2021.

For the quarter ended June 30, 2022, the bank had earned a total income of Rs 41,560 crore, up from about Rs 36,771 crore earned during the corresponding period of the previous year.

The bank's gross and net non-performing asset (NPA) as on June 30, 2022 stood at about Rs 18,033 crore and Rs 4,887 crore, respectively, as against Rs 17,098 crore and Rs 5,485 crore in the corresponding period of the previous year. - IANS

'Close monitoring of trade deficit, portfolio outflows warranted'

MUMBAI, July 16: Amid hostile international environment, close and continuous monitoring of the widening trade deficit and portfolio outflows is warranted, strong reserve buffers notwithstanding, an RBI article has stated.

The article, authored by a team led by Deputy Governor M D Patra, however, took comfort from the fact that recent moderation in commodity prices and easing of supply chain pressures would help the nation in escaping the global inflation trap.

The Indian economy remains resilient in the face of formidable global headwinds, it said, but added "knock-on effects of geopolitical spillovers are visible in several sectors, tapering the pace of recovery."

The international environment "is hostile and hence, close and continuous monitoring of the widening trade deficit and portfolio outflows is warranted, notwithstanding strong reserve buffers, moderating external

debt and a fairly valued exchange rate that has wilted less in the face the monotonic strengthening of the US dollar than many peers", the article on state of the economy published in the RBI Bulletin for July said.

The central bank said the views expressed in the article are those of the authors and do not necessarily represent the views of the Reserve Bank of India.

"In spite of this overwhelming shock, there are sparks in the wind that ignite the innate strength of the economy and set it on course to becoming the fastest growing economy in the world, though besieged it might be by fears of recession," it said.

In support of the argument, the authors said the recent revival of the southwest monsoon and rejuvenation of sowing activity has raised hopes of another bountiful year for agricultural activity, raising expectations that rural demand will soon catch up with urban spending and consolidate the recovery.

"The biggest source of relief is from inflation coming off its recent peak, albeit at an elevated level still. Nonetheless, the signs of its generalization and the potential unhinging of inflation expectations have elicited a pre-emptive and frontloaded monetary policy response," they said.

The article further said amidst all these developments, India's financial sector remains sound and stable.

If the commodity price moderation witnessed in recent weeks endures alongside the easing of supply chain pressures, the worst of the recent surge in inflation will be left behind, enabling the Indian economy to escape the global inflation trap and enjoy the fruits of the ebullient supply response that is taking place, it said.

India's merchandise trade deficit widened to its highest monthly level of USD 25.6 billion in June 2022 as against a deficit of USD 9.6 billion a year ago and USD 24.3 billion in May 2022. On a quarterly basis too, April-

June:2022-23 recorded the highest ever trade deficit of USD 70.3 billion.

In the foreign exchange market, the Indian rupee (INR) depreciated by 1 per cent vis-à-vis the US dollar (m-o-m) in June 2022 on the back of FPI equity outflows and strong US dollar.

This was also mirrored in the movement of the 40-currency real effective exchange rate (REER) which depreciated by 0.6 per cent in June 2022 over its level a month ago.

Foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) were net sellers in the Indian equity market for the ninth consecutive month in June, with an outflow of Rs 49,469 crore (highest monthly outflow since March 2020) and the sell-off continued in July (up to July 8, 2022) to the tune of Rs 3,716 crore.

Overall, FPIs have withdrawn Rs 1.2 lakh crore from the Indian equity market in 2022-23 so far, but the sell-off has been absorbed by domestic institutional investors (DIIs). - PTI

Gunmen kill 10 traders, hurt 2 in Indonesia's restive Papua

JAYAPURA, July 16: Gunmen believed to be separatist rebels killed 10 traders and wounded two others in an attack on Saturday in Indonesia's restive Papua province, police said.

Clashes have escalated in the country's easternmost province since last year, when rebels set fire to several schools and killed two teachers.

Attackers were believed to be members of the West Papua Liberation Army, the military wing of the Free Papua Organisation, police said.

About 20 gunmen stormed the village of Nogolait in Nduga district while a grocer was preparing to open his wares. They shot him and seven other traders who were on an open freight truck, along with four passersby, said Papua police spokesman Ahmad Musthofa Kamal. He said that most of the victims, all men, were immigrants from other Indonesian islands. Security forces found the bodies scattered in four separate areas.

Seven men were killed instantly while three others died at a nearby clinic, Kamal said. He said police and the military were searching for the attackers. A spokesperson for the Free Papua Organisation couldn't immediately be reached for comment.

On many occasions, rebel spokesman Sebby Sambom has said the group's fighters had warned civilians to leave areas the rebels consider a "war zone." He also urged workers to leave all Indonesian government projects, or they would be considered part of security forces.

Papua is a former Dutch colony in the western part of New Guinea that is ethnically and culturally distinct from much of Indonesia. Conflicts between indigenous Papuans and Indonesian security forces have raged for years. — AP

Biden meets with Arab Gulf leaders to counter Iran threat

JEDDAH (Saudi Arabia), July 16: President Joe Biden was using a summit of Arab nations on Saturday to lay out his strategy for the Middle East as he closes the final leg of a four-day trip meant to bolster U.S. Relationships in a region bracing for confrontation with Iran.

The president spent the morning meeting individually with the leaders of Iraq, Egypt and the United Arab Emirates, some of whom he had never sat down with.

Biden invited Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, who became president of the UAE two months ago, to visit the White House this year, saying he looked forward "to another period of strong and growing cooperation" between their countries under the sheik's leadership.

The Gulf Cooperation Council summit, which is being held in the Red Sea port city of Jeddah, is an opportunity for Biden to demonstrate his commitment to the region after spending most of his presidency focused on Russia's invasion of

Ukraine and China's growing influence in Asia.

Hours before the conference began, the White House released satellite imagery that indicates Russian officials have twice recently visited Iran to see weapons-capable drones it is looking to acquire for use in its war in Ukraine.

None of the countries represented at the summit have moved in lockstep with the U.S. To sanction Russia, a key foreign policy priority for the Biden administration. If anything, the UAE has emerged as a sort of financial haven for Russian billionaires and their multimillion-dollar yachts. Egypt remains open to Russian tourists.

Release satellite imagery that shows Russian officials visited Kashan Airfield on June 8 and July 15 to look at the drones could help the administration better tie the war's relevance to many Arab nations' own concerns about Iran's nuclear ambitions, missile program and support for militants in the region.



A senior Biden administration official, who briefed reporters before the summit, said Moscow's efforts to acquire drones from Tehran show that Russia is

"effectively making a bet on Iran."

Biden's attendance at the Gulf Cooperation Council summit followed his Friday meeting with Saudi Crown Prince Mo-

ammed bin Salman, the oil-rich kingdom's de facto ruler and heir to the throne currently held by his father, King Salman.

The president had initially shunned Prince Mohammed over human rights abuses, particularly the killing of U.S.-based writer Jamal Khashoggi, which U.S. Intelligence officials believe was likely approved by the crown prince.

But Biden decided he needed to repair the longstanding relationship between the two countries to address rising gas prices and foster stability in the volatile region.

Biden and Prince Mohammed greeted each other with a fist bump when the president arrived at the royal palace in Jeddah, a gesture that was swiftly criticised. Biden later said he did not shy away from discussing Khashoggi's killing during their meeting.

The topic created a "frosty" start to the discussion, according to a US official familiar with the private conversations. — AP

Wickremesinghe, Premadasa among four leaders to contest

COLOMBO, July 16: Sri Lanka's acting President Ranil Wickremesinghe, main Opposition leader Sajith Premadasa are among the four leaders who have joined the race to become the country's next President as the lawmakers met on Saturday to start the process of electing a new president to succeed Gotabaya Rajapaksa, who resigned after unprecedented protests against his government over the country's economic collapse.

Besides Wickremesinghe and Premadasa, Marxist JVP leader Anura Kumara Disanayake and Dulas Alahapath, a breakaway SLPP candidate, are the other two leaders who have so far announced their candidacy to contest the July 20 vote in Parliament to succeed Rajapaksa for the rest of his term until November 2024 after he resigned on Thursday.

Parliament met for a brief special session on Saturday

to announce the vacancy in the presidency following the resignation of Rajapaksa.

Rajapaksa, who fled to the Maldives on Wednesday and then landed in Singapore on Thursday, formally resigned on Friday, capping off a chaotic 72 hours in the crisis-hit

nation that saw protesters storm many iconic buildings, including the President and the Prime Minister's residences here.

During the 13-minute special session, Dhammika Dassanayake, Secretary General of Parliament, announced the vacancy for the post of President.

Dasanayake said that nominations for the election of the new president will be heard on Tuesday and if there is more

than one candidate, the lawmakers will vote on Wednesday.

Marxist Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP) leader Disanayake, 53, on Saturday officially declared his intention to contest the election.

"The main reason for this is that we feel that our party and our leader represents many of the aspirations and in fact the spirit of the people's movement that has been taking place in our country for so long," his party's spokesperson Harini Amarasinghe told reporters.

Main Opposition Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB) leader Premadasa, while officially declaring his intention to contest the vote, said, "Even though it is an uphill struggle, I am convinced that truth will prevail."

The 225-member Parliament is dominated by Rajapaksa's ruling Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP) party. — PTI

Xi in Xinjiang, signals no change to Uyghur policy

BEIJING, July 16: Chinese leader Xi Jinping, on a visit this week to the Xinjiang region where his government is widely accused of oppressing predominantly Muslim ethnic minorities, showed no signs of backing off policies that have come under harsh criticism from the US and many European countries.

Xi stressed the full and faithful implementation of his ruling Communist Party's approach in the region, highlighting social stability and lasting security as the overarching goals, the official Xinhua News Agency said on Friday.

Under his leadership, authorities have carried out a sweeping crackdown on Xinjiang's Uyghur and Kazakh communities following an outburst of deadly separatist violence. While no exact figure has been released, analysts say hundreds of thou-



sands and likely a million or more people have been detained over time.

Critics have described the crackdown that placed thousands in prison-like indoctrination camps as cultural genocide. The US and others have placed officials responsible under visa bans for their part in extralegal detentions, separation of families and incarceration of people for studying abroad

or having foreign contacts.

Xi, on what was described as an "inspection tour" from Tuesday to Friday, said that enhanced efforts should be made to uphold the principle that Islam in China must be Chinese in orientation, Xinhua said.

While the needs of religious believers should be ensured, they should be united closely to the Communist Party and the government,

the official news agency quoted him as saying.

He called for educating and guiding people of all ethnic groups to strengthen their identification with the Chinese nation, culture and Communist Party.

The Chinese leader called Xinjiang a "core area and a hub" in China's programme of building ports, railways and power stations connecting it to economies reaching from Central Asia to Eastern Europe. The US has blocked some imports of cotton and other products from the region over reports of forced labour.

Xi met with leaders of the Xinjiang Production and Construction Corps, a supra-government body that operates its own courts, schools and health system under a military system imposed on the region after the Communist Party took power in China in 1949. — AP

Ivana Trump's death ruled an accident, NYC examiner says

NEW YORK, July 16: Ivana Trump, the first wife of former President Donald Trump and mother to his eldest children, died accidentally from blunt impact injuries to her torso, the New York City medical examiner's office said on Friday.

Police had been looking into whether she fell down the stairs, two people familiar with the matter told The Associated Press on Thursday. They spoke on condition of anonymity because they could not discuss the matter publicly.

The medical examiner's brief report did not specify when the accident took place. Donald Trump announced on Thursday that Ivana died at her home near Central Park



on Manhattan's Upper East Side. She was 73.

Her son Eric Trump said it was "a very sad day, a very sad day," as he left the home on Thursday.

A Czech-born ski racer and businesswoman, Ivana Trump was born Ivana Zelnickova in 1949.

She was married to the

former President from 1977 to 1992, and they had three children together: Donald Jr, Ivanka and Eric.

The Trumps became a 1980s power couple, and she managed one of his Atlantic City casinos as well as helped with the décor of Trump Tower. Their marriage ended in a messy, public divorce

after Donald Trump met his next wife, Marla Maples.

But in recent years, Ivana Trump had been on good terms with her ex-husband. She wrote in a 2017 book that they spoke about once a week.

Her death came during a fraught time for the Trump family. Two of her children, Donald Jr and Ivanka, as well as the former President were due to appear in the coming days for questioning in the New York Attorney General's civil investigation into the family's business practices. But the Attorney General's office agreed to postpone the depositions — a term for out-of-court questioning under oath — because of Ivana Trump's death. — AP

Murali Sreeshankar becomes 1st Indian male long jumper to qualify for finals

EUGENE (USA), July 16: Murali Sreeshankar became the first Indian male long jumper to qualify for World Athletics Championships finals while 3000m steeple-chaser Avinash Sable also expectedly made the grade on the first day of the competitions here.

Sreeshankar, who had entered the championships as a dark horse for a medal at second spot in the season's top list, had a best jump of exactly 8m, which he did in his second attempt, to finish second in qualification round Group B and seventh overall.

Anju Bobby George was the first Indian to make it to the World Championships long jump finals and first to win a medal – bronze in 2003 edition in Paris.

Two other Indians in the fray, Jeswin Aldrin, who was cleared for the championships despite failing to impress the national selectors in two rounds of trials, and Muhammed Anees Yahiya could not make it to the finals after finishing ninth and 11th in Group A qualification round with best jumps of 7.79m and 7.73m respectively.

Those who achieved 8.15m or the 12 best per-

formers from across the two groups qualify for the finals to be held on Sunday (6.50 am IST).

The 23-year-old Sreeshankar has been a consistent performer with his 8.36m jump at the Federation Cup in April, followed by 8.31m and 8.23m at an event in Greece and National Inter-State Champion-

ships respectively.

Only Japan's Yuki Hashioka (8.18m) and Marquis Dendy (8.16m) of USA crossed the 8.15m mark during the qualification round of two groups.

Olympic champion Miltiadis Tentoglou (8.03m) of Greece, who won Group B qualification round ahead of Sreeshankar, world season leader Simon Ehammer

(8.09m) of Switzerland and Cuba's Tokyo Olympics bronze medallist Maykel Masso (7.93m) were also among those who qualified for the finals.

The 27-year-old Sable, who had also qualified for the 3000m steeplechase final during 2019 edition in Doha, finished third in heat number 3 clocking 8:18.75 to qualify

for the finals to be held on Monday (early morning Tuesday in India).

He led till around midway before Hailemariam Amare (8:18.34) of Ethiopia and Evan Jager (8:18.44) of USA took over him.

The top three in each heat and the next six fastest runners across the three heats qualify for the final.

Sable has been in a national record breaking spree in recent times with the latest being the 8:12.48 effort while finishing fifth at the prestigious Diamond League Meeting in Rabat last month.

Asian record holder shot putter Tajinderpal Singh Toor, however, pulled out of his event due to a groin injury sustained four days ago after reaching USA. He tried a couple of practice throws before the event but decided to skip the event as the pain did not subside.

"I had this groin injury four days back after reaching Chula Vista (USA). I had a couple of warm-up throws to see if the pain is still there. I still felt the pain while throwing, so I decided to pull out of the event," Toor, who has 'No Mark (NM)' against his name, told PTI.

Worst phase of Indian football, rues journalist Jaydeep Basu

GUWAHATI, July 16: Renowned sports journalist Jaydeep Basu rued at the deplorable condition of Indian football administration at the present scenario while delivering the 6th Pulin Das Memorial Lecture in Guwahati on Saturday.

Basu who is also a member of the Committee of Administrators (CoA) under the instruction of the Supreme Court to run the affairs of AIFF, said that this is possibly the worst phase of Indian football. "It is so unfortunate what has happened with the AIFF (All India Football Federation). Never ever in the 85-year-old history of Indian football such a thing has happened," said Basu.

Supreme Court had to intervene when the AIFF headed by Praful Patel failed to conduct elections for a long time. Now if the AIFF fails to conduct an independent election before September 12, they are likely to be banned by FIFA.

"This has put Indian football in huge uncertainty. If FIFA puts a ban on India, there will be no recognition of all the tournaments. Who

will take the responsibility of the future of thousands of footballers from across the country," Basu opined.

The event was organised by Assam Sports Journalists Association (ASJA) in association with the Pulin Das Memorial Committee at the Landmark Hotel in RG Baruah Sports Complex, here.

Basu termed Pulin Das' contribution towards the sports and sports journalism in Assam as huge. He also spoke on sports journalism completing 100 years in Assam.

This year's lecture was significant as the ASJA is also celebrating the Centenary Year of Sports Journalism in Assam. "To complete 100 years is a huge achievement indeed. Hundred years ago, leave alone journalism, Indian sports was in infancy. So, I must say, it has been quite a journey," said Basu during his speech.

Public Health Engineering and Tourism minister of Assam Jayanta Malla Barua who was the chief guest elaborated on the role played by the sports journalists and especially Pulin Das who was the pioneer.

Prior to this, other prominent personalities who delivered the annual lecture are

PV Sindhu sails into Singapore Open final

SINGAPORE, July 16: Indian shuttler PV Sindhu stormed into the Singapore Open title clash with a commanding win over lower-ranked Japanese Saena Kawakami in the women's singles semifinal, here on Saturday.

Sindhu, a double Olympic medallist, who had claimed two Super 300 titles at Syed Modi International and Swiss Open this year, prevailed 21-15, 21-7 over world number 38 Kawakami in a 32-minute last-four clash. The 27-year-old from Hyderabad, who has also claimed a bronze at the Asian Championships this year, is now one win away from her maiden Super 500 title of the 2022 season.

In the finals, the third seeded Indian will face China's 22-year-old Wang Zhi Yi, the reigning Asian Championships gold medallist, who was also part of the Uber Cup team, which won the silver at Bangkok this year. Wang beat Japan's Ohori Aya 21-14, 21-14.

Sindhu had defeated world number 11 Wang in their only meeting at the All England Championships this year. A two-time World Junior Champion and a Youth Olympics silver medallist, Wang had also reached the finals of Indonesia Open Super 1000 in June.

Sindhu came into the match with a 2-0 head-to-head record, having played



her last at the 2018 China Open. Kawakami had received a walk-over from top-seed Tai Tzu Ying of Chinese Taipei in the second round.

A former world number 15, Kawakami, winner of the 2019 Orleans Masters and a finalist at Swiss Open the same year, was a part of the Japanese women's team that won the bronze medal in May this year. The Japanese had played just three events last year and it was her fifth tournament in 2022.

Sindhu, a former world champion, looked in complete command against Kawakami, who just couldn't control the shuttle and was buried in a heap of errors during the lop-sided match.

Early on, Sindhu started with her whipping smashes but the drift inside the hall, made decision making difficult and also at times, the precision was lacking.

But the power in her stroke-play helped the Indi-

an move to a healthy three-point lead at the break.

The 24-year-old Japanese, however, started putting the shuttle in from difficult positions to draw parity. The match came alive with both fighting for each point.

Sindhu also won two video referrals, punished a weak high lift and also made good calls at the baseline to move to 18-14. A power-packed smash and then two unforced errors by Kawakami helped Sindhu seal the opening game comfortably.

Kawakami's struggles continued in the second game as she failed to control the shuttle and conceded a 0-5 early lead to her fancied rival.

Sindhu just had to keep engaging her rival in the rallies and patiently wait for her mistakes. A frustrated Kawakami just could wrily smile as Sindhu first grabbed a 11-4 lead at the mid-game interval and then zoomed to 17-5 in a jiffy. – PTI

3rd ODI

India need to change batting approach in series decider

MANCHESTER, July 16: Jolted by a thumping defeat in its last game, the Indian team is expected to tweak its batting template from cautious to a more fearless one in the series-deciding third ODI against England here on Sunday.

The team under Rohit Sharma did put up an ultra-aggressive batting show with a great degree of success during the recently concluded T20 International series but the manner in which it chased a below-par target of 247 in the second ODI has left a lot to be desired.

Rohit would put his hand up and admit that he and other veteran Shikhar Dhawan, were a bit on the defensive in the wake of some fine swing and seam bowling from Reece Topley and David Willey.

That Virat Kohli's endless saga of failures has only compounded the problems is also a big factor but senior openers playing out two maiden overs at the start, didn't indicate a positive mindset either.

Therefore a change in approach is required and for that a paradigm shift in the mindset while going for the tricky run-chases unlike the first game at the Oval where the game was single-handedly won by Jasprit Bumrah's six-wicket haul.

"I want these guys to take the game on and see if they can find something different about their own game rather

than looking at the team's role. If they get the team out of that situation imagine the confidence they are going to get from that," Rohit had said after the second game.

The approach of going for leather from the word "go" worked wonderfully in T20 Internationals and there is no reason that it can't work in the 50-over format which many teams see as an extension of two T20 innings.

In fact, even England's star-studded batting line-up has looked complete out-of-sorts in the two games and suddenly it seemed that hosts with power hitters of the calibre of Jos Buttler, Jonny Bairstow, Jason Roy, Ben Stokes and Liam Livingstone are playing an archaic one day game.

But India won't mind as long as these formidable men are being kept under tight leash but the visitors would have to alter their playbook. And it will be a challenge in a morning ODI at the Old Trafford where the ball moves appreciably and India have their 2019 World Cup semifinal defeat in mind at this venue.

Rohit's approach in most of the games isn't a problem but Indian team management led by head coach Rahul Dravid will have its own set of issues if the 37-year-old Dhawan is their choice going into next year's 2023 ODI World Cup. – PTI

Felix gets a bronze on her farewell at world championships

EUGENE (Oregon), July 16: Allyson Felix won her 19th and final medal in the World Championships – a bronze she took after running the second leg of America's 4x400-metres in the mixed relay that's been touted as the last major race of the 36-year-old's career.

Felix decided to enter only in the mixed relay after failing to qualify for the worlds in an individual race. The 19th medal, the third bronze over her 10 trips to the championships, extends the record she already held.

Adding to her 11 medals from the Olympics – a record for any American in track and field – she now has an even 30 from her sport's two biggest events.

Elijah Godwin had a slim lead when he passed the baton to Felix, and for the first 200 metres of her last lap around the track, she extended her lead and was running virtually alone in the backstretch. But she faded and was caught by Marileidy Paulino of the eventual gold-medal winners, the Dominican Republic.

Vernon Norwood recaptured the lead on the third leg, but the Dominican's Fiordaliza Cofil overtook American Kennedy Simon on the anchor, and then hurdler Femke Bol of

the Netherlands made a huge late charge to win the silver. The Dominican Republic won in 3 minutes, 9.82 seconds, with a margin of

0.08 seconds.

But much like the end of Felix's career, her last big evening on the track was about more

than just the race. It was a celebration of a once-in-a-lifetime athlete who came to the scene as a shy teenager and left as an outspoken advocate for women and moms both in and out of sports.

Google got into the act. A search of her name brought up all her credentials, overlaid by animation of her sprinting across the computer screen followed by the words "Olympian. Mother. Advocate."

All part of a fitting finale for the mother of 3-year-old Cammy, who said she's looking forward to being "normal," focusing on her family, and not having to get up for workouts with her famed taskmaster of a coach, Bobby Kersee.

The stands were about two-thirds full for Felix's farewell on the opening night of action at the first worlds to be held in the United States. Felix's last medal capped off an opening day that also featured heats in the men's 100m.

American Fred Kerley, last year's Olympic silver medallist, finished his race in 9.79 seconds – a blazing-fast time for a preliminary round that was only 0.03 off his season high and was 0.01 faster than Italian Marcel Jacobs' victory last year in Tokyo. – AP

Sunday

It's a lazy Sunday morning and none of them are scurrying around the house to use the bathroom first or to occupy a space in front of the dressing mirror. Priya (name changed), the youngest one, is pairing her olive cargo pants with a white tee for an outing. Hiranya, the eldest, is immersed in picking each husk and grit, batch by batch, from a mound of rice. In another corner, Rinki is swapping between two TV channels to find something interesting to watch as the aroma of fried onions from the kitchen envelops the living room.

After all, it's the only day they get a day off, cook an elaborate meal, and let their hair down!

What seems to be a usual Sunday in any common household is, in fact, the scene in a shared home of six women — who were once called lunatics, beggars and homeless. Each one of them, having a mental health condition, was rescued either by the police or the NGOs — roaming aimlessly on the roads, scantily clad, emanating repulsive smell, picking eatables from the garbage, hurling expletives at pesky passers-by, or sitting under a flyover. These women are suitably employed now. They have their own bank accounts and PAN cards, and even operate smartphones.

The shared home, run by Ashadeep in the Rehabari area of Guwahati, houses a group of women, who have substantially recovered from their mental health issues, to help them lead 'normal' lives. The home chronicles several stories of transformation, telling how the right treatment and support can be life-changing for persons with mental illness, even as they are disowned by their families.

Priya Chhetry, hailing from Tezpur, has seizures with mental retardation and psychosis. She recalls how her father offered her a tour to Guwahati, just days after his second marriage. A motherless child with a mental condition, Priya was left alone on the streets of Guwahati by her father. A teenaged Priya was rescued from Uzanbazar by Latacil police. At that time, she was uncooperative, did not maintain personal hygiene, and also had frequent seizures. With the help of medicines and psycho-social interventions, a lot of difference was noticed in her quickly. With regular interventions, she showed remarkable improvement in the past ten years. Presently, Priya is working in Atma Nirbhar, a packaging unit, along with four other residents from the Ashadeep home and earning Rs. 3000 per month.

"Shared housing is an independent set-up where four to five people live together in a house. Unlike institutionalised care homes for mental illness, the residents here do not have to follow any set routine because of their high functional level. We just depute one healthcare assistant to keep track of their medications and help them occasionally," says Rukiya

A safe haven

Choudhury, a senior social worker.

Hiranya Rajkonwar was rescued by Ashadeep staff from Bora Service, Guwahati, in 2007. After treatment, she was reintegrated with her family in Dibrugarh in 2008. Eventually, as her husband passed away, she moved to her daughter's house. In 2009, she was again spotted in Guwahati with the symptoms of relapse. After a few months of treatment, she was reintegrated with her sister. In July 2015, Hiranya was spotted again on the Chandmari

flyover, creating nuisance, when the police called the NGO for help. Since then, she has been with Ashadeep — first in institutional care, and later, in shared housing.

"Timely medicines and regular check-ups are the key to mental health treatment. It's a prolonged process and the problem relapses when the patient skips the medicines continuously," says Manisha Rabha — the healthcare assistant staying in the shared home.

"Here the residents take

care of each other's medicines and report to me if anyone skips it. The social environment and an increase in self-worth have helped them a great deal in coming out of their conditions. Barring occasional assistance in shopping and paperwork, they are totally independent and happy," Manisha adds.

Sangeeta Adhikary, a bipolar affective disorder (BPAD) case, was spotted on a busy street of Guwahati by the police. Aggressive and abusive at that time, she showed delusions of grandiosity. The caregivers got to know that she hailed from an upper middle-class family in Guwahati and used to teach in a reputed school. She was already on medication, but her condition deteriorated after the demise of her parents and she walked out of her house one day.

"After proper care and intervention, although she recovered, her brother's family refused to accept her. She was brought back to Ashadeep where she started teaching children with intellectual disability and persons recovering from mental illness," adds Choudhury. Sangeeta was bestowed the 'Brave Heart Award' by The Hans Foundation in March 2020 in New Delhi.

Forty-five-year-old Chitrili Medhi is fond of gold ornaments. After a remarkable recovery from mental illness, she has saved enough to buy a pair of gold bangles for herself.

Similarly, Rinky Barman (name changed) was only 17, when she was referred by an NGO working for the rehabilitation of trafficked women. Diagnosed with 'seizure disorder with psychosis', she had several episodes of relapses and she even ran away once from the State Home for Women. At the age of 31 now, Rinky's condition has improved much, and she is engaged in household chores of the shared home.

"My mother-in-law pushed me out of the train as I was ill. She is a bad woman and I don't want to go there ever again," Sunaina Tiwari, another resident of the shared home, admits determinedly. Sunaina, who has mild retardation with hearing impairment, has worked as a domestic help and is loved by the residents for her excellent culinary skills.

Since this concept of a shared home has proved to be very successful in augmenting the functionality level of such persons, Ashadeep is starting two more such homes, one each in Assam and Nagaland, this year. The plan for creating four more such homes is on the anvil. This model can also be highly successful in those cases where acute symptoms of mental health issues are under control.

With the news that the iconic Ambassador will vroom back on Indian roads in a new bold Electric Vehicle (EV) version, nostalgia returns over the country's first indigenously built car which was once the symbol of pre-liberalised India. Recently, Uttam Bose, managing director and chief executive officer of Hindustan Motors — the CK Birla group company that manufactured the iconic Ambassador car for over half a century, officially confirmed that the Amby will come back in a new electric model. An estimated Rs. 600 crore is being invested on the design and engine of the EV "Amby" model in a joint venture with French carmaker Peugeot.

"We have just started the R&D work. This hatchback version of the Ambassador will have all kinds of features and better interior, which a new-age customer looks for," Bose told a business daily.

The Hindustan Ambassador was based on the Morris Oxford series III model, first made by Morris Motors Limited in the United Kingdom. For generations of Indians, it was 'the' car till it ran out of commercial fuel one day in May 2014. After nearly three years, Amby, as this enduring symbol of post-Independence India is fondly called, found a French partner to refuel its journey,

albeit hurting its Made in India pride. In 2017, the Ambassador brand was sold to Peugeot SA for Rs. 80 crores, according to reports. The deal was finalised nearly five years ago by the CK Birla group which owns Hindustan Motors, the parent company of the grand

contraption.

Established in 1942 by CK Birla's grandfather, BM Birla, Hindustan Motors was the first indigenous carmaker of India. During the 1970s, the Ambassador enjoyed a 75 per cent market share. The slide started when Maruti Suzuki launched the Maruti 800 in 1983. But as cabs it remained popular.

Now, with the news of a French

takeover first and then the more recent news of an EV makeover, it has triggered nostalgia and a sense of déjà vu. The Ambassador plant at Uttarpara (Hind Motor), near Kolkata was closed in 2014. The factory at Uttarpara is spread over 420 acres, located less than an hour-and-a-half's drive from Kolkata, the capital of West Bengal. Even a railway station (Hind Motor) was named after Hindustan Motors after the plant was set up in 1948. Since 2014, though, the plant area has looked desolate. For a car as magnificent as the Ambassador, the lack of demand forced it into an early retirement. "We were shocked to learn that the factory would be closed down like this all of a sudden. We had no inclination," Kaushik Chakraborty, a worker, had said during the closure when the news that the factory would be shut down came as a rude shock to him.

While many are happy that it has found a French buyer and would come back in a new EV avatar, many others have rued the fact that the automobile brand had to be sold for such a low price to a foreign auto major. While the best advertisement for the good old Amby (often called a diplomatic limousine in old India) was the Indian Prime Minister and all other ministers, it remains to be seen how the EV does once it hits the road.

On a mission



JATINDRA SARMA has contributed immensely to eradicate harmful plants and discover new ones.

As the world becomes more connected, invasive species have spread further, posing greater threats to our ecosystems, agriculture, and even food security. Hundreds of forests and habitats across the globe are ravaged by them, and the ramifications are truly alarming. Invasive plant species frequently alter ecology by driving native crops to extinction, destroying terrestrial or aquatic vegetation, and polluting the native gene pool through cross-breeding. Invasive species have caused the extinction of at least 142 native species and endangered as many as 500 species globally, according to a study conducted by the University of Tennessee.

A UNESCO World Heritage site — the Kaziranga National Park, home to the famous one-horned rhinos, is no exception. More than poachers, the National Park is today faced with a much larger threat — invasion by dangerous plant species that threaten to destroy the habitats of greater one-horned rhinos and other herbivores. And the man who is on a mission to eradicate the menace of invasive plant species is none other than the Field Director of the National Park, Jatindra Sarma.

During his frequent forays into the wild, Sarma stumbled upon certain invasive plant species growing gregariously and at an alarming pace. "While venturing out in different pockets and ranges of the KNP, I have come across certain species of plants of invasive nature posing grave threat to habitats of the herbivores," said Sarma.

Sarma, who is an authority on medicinal plants and mushrooms found in North-East India with more than 25 scientific papers to his credit, said, "Some plants identified to be weeds and even though they possess herbal properties, their toxicity outweighs their utility."

He has identified 18 species of invasive plant species among which *Bombax ceiba* and *Lagerstroemia speciosa* trees — locally called *simolu* and *ejar*, growing gregariously, need immediate attention to save the grasslands on which the rhinos and other herbivores thrive.

Sarma has submitted a list of the invasive plant species to the Wildlife Institute of India (WII) and sought permission from Assam's Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) for experimental culling, cutting, slashing, uprooting, and girdling of the invasive plants under the National Tiger Conservation Authority following discussions with WII experts.

Sarma also noticed that some plants he stumbled upon were not weeds but were highly economic species. He came across a poisonous plant of the *Solanaceae* family — *Cestrum diurnum*, growing luxuriantly in some areas of the park. "Although a weed, it is of highly medicinal value, being a source of Vitamin D-3. This particular weed can be turned into potential crop for economic uplift of residents living around the Park," he quipped. Talks are on with a Delhi-based firm for commercial cultivation of the species through the Eco-Development Committees (EDCs). This firm requires ten tonnes of dry leaves per month.

A senior IFS officer of the Assam-Meghalaya cadre, Sarma has discovered many rare and high-value medicinal plants such as *Amomum pratisthana* (a new ginger species), *Syzygium niva* (small *jamun* tree with edible fruits), *Garcinia sibeswari* (an edible fruit like *thekera*) and has even named these after his family members and close friends.

Pavetta puffi is named after his friend, late Dr. Christian Puff, a famous taxonomist from an Austrian University, who had done extensive work on *Rubiaceae*, an ornamental plant.

Smilax sailenii is named after Botanist late Prof. Sailenii Borah of Gauhati University.

Nothapodytes nimmoniana was rediscovered by Sarma after a gap of 98 years. Explaining the plant's medicinal properties, he said, "A compound/alkaloid called camptothecin has been found to be present in the plant which is used for treatment of ovarian and colon cancer and AIDS. A rare species, I have located only two trees in entire Assam."

His book, *Medicinal Plants & Mushrooms of India (Vol I & Vol II)* has earned him rave reviews and is used in universities in India and abroad, including Oxford.

It was Sarma's friend and mentor, renowned taxonomist John D. Mood, who ignited his pursuits in the world of medicinal plants. The American scientist told him, "The bud has come out, you have to bloom now."

"These words stirred me to plunge headlong into the world of medicinal plants. I started frequenting forests and hills of the region, leading to the discovery of many new plants of high value, and old ones that had been considered extinct for nearly 100 years," Sarma said.

Eminent botanist from the Weihenstephan-Triesdorf University of Applied



Sciences, Germany, Prof. Dr. Herbert Riepl asked Sarma to document all his work for posterity. "This made me think about it, and I decided to do formal documentation of all my discoveries and related works from thereon," Sarma revealed.

"Exploring the hidden treasures of our forests and documenting them with their medicinal values, lest some get extinct, and targeting their conservation was the prime need of the hour. Wild mushrooms have tremendous medicinal properties which need to be explored and harnessed for the good of humanity," Sarma said.

The good news is that a scheme is being introduced in the National Park for livelihood enhancement through cultivation of mushrooms by womenfolk in EDCs. "Experts have been roped in so that the downtrodden womenfolk do not lag behind," he added.

As CCF of Barak Valley, Sarma is excited about the upcoming ambitious project — the Cachar wildlife safari-cum-open zoo. Said Sarma, "It will be a place where people will see the wonders of Nature and wildlife. A herbal garden with medicinal and endemic plants will also come up. When people go for safari, they will not only see animals but also experience the rich biodiversity of Barak Valley in its entirety."

Dr. Binita Pathak, from the Physics Department of Dibrugarh University, was recently selected for the prestigious SERB – Women Excellence Award 2022 by the Science & Engineering Research Board, India. The latter is a statutory body established to support basic research in emerging areas of science and engineering.

Pathak here talks about her area of work and about women in STEM.

Many congratulations on winning the prestigious award. Please let us know a little about the research you will be undertaking and its impact, especially in North-East India.

Thank you very much for your kind wishes. Under this award, firstly, I have proposed to see how trace gases, including greenhouse gases, and aerosols (solid particles and liquid droplets) present in the atmosphere, emitted by various human activities, are contributing to climate change in the Northeastern part of India.

Secondly, I will be assessing the impact of climate change on crop productivity. Winter rainfall plays a significant role in tea production and *kharif* cultivation, but there has been a sharp decline in winter rainfall over the eastern part of North-East India, where most of the tea gardens are located. This is consistent with the decline in tea production over the last 30 years. Thus, our plan is to study if there has been a similar impact on rice production too over the last 30-40 years. Thirdly, we are planning to study the impact of climate change on the hydrological cycle.

Scientists say that accurately modelling the intensity of aerosol effects on climate change is vital to humanity's future. Could you explain it in simple terms why it is so?

Yes, definitely. It is important to understand the impact of aerosols on the climate system in order to predict climate change. Some aerosols like sulfate, nitrates, sea salts, organic

carbon, etc., are of the 'scattering' type as they scatter back solar radiation into space more efficiently, thus, reducing it, and, thereby, cooling the surface and the atmosphere. But, again, aerosol pollution kills 4.2 million people annually, and the sources of most of these aerosols are common; so if we think of, let's say, allowing a particular source (say biomass burning) to emit only organic carbon to cool the atmosphere, it won't work as black carbon is a co-emitter.

Again, all the aerosols participate in cloud formation by acting as cloud condensation nuclei (CCN), which means without aerosols, clouds can never be formed – this is termed as

'indirect effect' or 'aerosol-cloud interaction'. Low-level clouds scatter back incoming solar radiation, thereby cooling the atmosphere, while high-level clouds are transparent but absorb terrestrial (radiation going out from earth) radiation and warm the atmosphere. Thus, it is difficult to accurately quantify whether aerosols cool or warm the atmosphere simultaneously over a region. This uncertainty is caused by aerosol complexity and therefore, needs more detailed research.

What can we do to mitigate human-made aerosols which are emitted from vehicle exhausts, the smokestacks of factories, etc.?

We have to take mitigation measures simultaneously for aerosols and trace gases, the sources being common to both, as aerosol mitigation alone is genuinely not possible. Generally speaking, innovative technology, alternate fuels and government policies can play a big role in the mitigation of trace gases and aerosols. Pollution norms should also be strictly implemented not only for vehicles but also for factories, smokestacks, etc. At an individual level, by limiting the use of vehicles, and

The extreme step

The alarming rate of suicides among Indian women is a cause of concern.

Palavi's life was moving along the path chalked out by her well-meaning parents who failed to realise the many demons that the 21-year-old was fighting within her. One day, their world came crashing down as they found her hanging in her room with a note on the bedside table detailing her agony and struggles to live the life they wanted for her.

For 35-year old Manasi, life was all that she had dreamt to be — a successful career, a loving family, frequent holidays and hobbies to pursue but she was plagued by a constant sadness within her and she was diagnosed to be suffering from deep depression. It was in one such moment of weakness that she walked out of her house towards the river and jumped into it.

There are many more such cases that can be highlighted but what appears to be the crux of the matter is that suicides by women are increasing at an alarming rate that needs to be discussed and analysed at length.

Deteriorating mental health, triggered by clinical depression or other medical conditions or situations like domestic violence, societal pressures, financial problems and varied factors have been listed by experts as the primary causes that lead most women to take their lives as they reach a point of no return.

Asia accounts for 60 per cent of the world's suicides, which indicates that 60 million people are affected by suicide or attempted suicide in the continent each year. Experts have pointed out that men and women differ in their roles, responsibilities, status and power and these socially constructed differences interact with biological variations, contributing to contrasts in their suicidal behaviour. Rates of suicide in most countries are higher in males than females, with China being an exception with higher rates in females, especially young women in rural parts of the country.

According to a study by the Lancet Public Health, women in India accounted for 36 per cent of the global female suicide deaths, though they constitute less than 18 per cent of the world's female population. Suicide is India's leading cause of death among women in the age group of 15 to 29, and rates for young and middle-aged women rank the highest among countries with similar demographics. The study further pointed out that increasing suicides among women may be related to a conflict between women's "increasing education and empowerment and the persistence of their lower status in Indian society".

A professor of global health at the Public Health Foundation of India and the University of Washington, Rakhi Dandona, pointed out that the situation may be related to a clash between women's aspirations and the rigidity of their social environment. As India has developed, women have become better educated and more empowered and arranged marriages have declined. Yet in "many aspects of society, women still possess lower status and face barriers to opportunity. This disconnect may drive some to despair," she pointed out.

The study further said that suicide rates are particularly higher in Southern Indian states, where development and social advances have accelerated. In contrast, suicide rates in the rural, more traditional northern states could be lower because women there may have "less knowledge that they could actually live a better life".

Domestic violence, both physical and emotional, is also a predominant risk factor, while young mothers are prone to prenatal and post-partum depression due to limited support system around. There are also other factors like poverty, relationship with partners, limited support from families, cultural and social conditions that lead to stress and subsequent death by suicide.

Social support — for both women and men, is required to deal with a situation that makes a person hit rock bottom, a point from where there is no return. Unfortunately, that kind of system is not readily available in India where suicide is still considered as a personal choice that someone has made. It is not considered a public health issue that needs to be addressed by the government, health systems, non-profit organisations and even workplaces.

There is an urgent need to ensure a data-driven, gender-specific strategy and the need to talk about mental health, institutional structures and deconstruct the stigma associated with it to deal with this situation.

Amritsari-style chole

Ingredients:

- Chickpeas, soaked overnight or for eight hours (minimum)..... 500 gms
- Black tea bags..... 4
- Black cardamoms..... 8 to 10
- Pomegranate seeds, dried..... 1 tbsp
- Green chillies..... 6 to 10
- Ginger-garlic paste..... 5 to 6 tbsps
- Amchur (mango powder)..... 2 tbsps
- Coriander powder..... 2 tbsps
- Cumin powder..... 1 tsp
- Garam masala powder..... 1 tsp
- Salt..... to taste
- Ghee..... 3 to 4 tbsps
- Onions, finely chopped..... 4
- Bay leaves..... 2 to 4
- Tomatoes, finely chopped..... 5 to 6
- Coriander, chopped..... 2 tbsps

Method: Drain the chickpeas and cook in a pressure cooker along with the cardamoms and the tea bags for five to six whistles.

Discard the tea bags and the cardamoms after

boiling. Keep the chickpeas aside.

In a blender, blend the pomegranate seeds and the green chillies. Mix together with the ginger-garlic paste, amchur, coriander powder, cumin powder, garam masala powder, and the salt.

Heat the ghee in a pan and saute the onions, until soft and translucent. Add the ground spices and stir-fry again. Add the bay leaves.

Add the tomatoes and cook until they turn soft and mushy.

Add the boiled chickpeas and stir well to coat in the spices. Bring to a boil and lower the heat until the gravy is thick.

Transfer to a serving bowl and garnish with chopped coriander.

Serve hot with roti or bhature.

Steamed scallion buns

Ingredients:

- White flour..... 300 gms
- Dry yeast..... 1 tsp
- Salt..... 1 tsp
- Water..... 150 ml
- Oil..... 1 tbsp
- Spring onions, finely chopped..... 1 bunch
- Salt..... 1/2 tsp
- Sesame seeds, toasted..... 1 tsp

Method: Place the flour, yeast and salt in a large bowl. Add the water and mix with a spoon to form a dough.

Transfer to a work surface and knead with your hands for five to six minutes to form a soft and smooth dough. Put the dough in a bowl and brush a little oil and cover. Keep aside for an hour for the dough to rise and prove.

Meanwhile, heat a tablespoon of oil in a pan and add the chopped spring onions and stir-fry for two to three minutes. Add salt and the sesame seeds. Stir again. Turn off the heat and allow it to cool.

Take the dough and punch down the air and knead for a minute. Sprinkle some flour on the surface and roll out the dough into a ¼-inch thick rectangle.

Spread the spring onion mixture over the rolled dough and fold lengthwise, three times. Pat down to remove any air pocket.

Cut into one-inch strips, and stretch each strip and twist them to make a round shape.

Continue to do this until all the dough is used. Keep them covered for another hour to allow them to rise. Place the remaining oil in a frying pan and place the buns on it. Put one-fourth cup of water and cover the pan. The steam will cook the buns. Cook over medium flame for ten minutes or until all the water has evaporated.

Take them off heat and serve them with chilli oil.

Vegan diet

Being vegan is considered a healthy choice nowadays.



Being vegan could be a dietary need or a lifestyle choice. One might turn vegan out of concern for the way animals are treated, sometimes, maybe for religious beliefs, and environmental factors, too. Vegan diets tend to include plenty of fruits, vegetables, beans, nuts and seeds. Animal products, including meat, dairy and eggs, are completely avoided.

Eating a variety of plant-based foods provides a wide range of important vitamins, minerals, healthy fats and protein. It's a new trend whereby huge numbers of people are moving towards a vegan diet due to increasing lifestyle diseases like CVD, obesity, HTN, diabetes, gout, autoimmune diseases, etc.

Benefits of a vegan diet:

Vegan diets tend to be rich in phytonutrients and low in saturated fats which can improve heart health, protect us against cancer, and lower the risk of type 2 diabetes. However, people eating only plant-based foods need to be more aware of how to obtain certain nutrients, including iron, calcium and Vitamin B12, which are usually obtained from an omnivorous diet. Veganism is an excellent dietary choice for those who have constipation and/or irritable bowel syndrome. It's a better way to control high blood pressure or a family history of coronary artery disease or stroke. It can be a great way to get into a lifelong habit of healthy eating. Veganism can also reduce animal suffering and advocate for a more compassionate world by avoiding products obtained from animals.



Is being vegetarian and vegan the same?

Vegetarian and vegan are two different terms — vegetarians do not eat any kind of meat or fish, but consume dairy products and some may eat eggs, while a vegan diet excludes all products with animal-based ingredients like bakery items, sweets, desserts, smoothies, ice cream, honey, pudding, etc.

How to follow a vegan diet?

To eat a nutritionally balanced diet, including appropriate amounts of micro and macronutrients from only plant sources needs careful planning in order to meet the adequate energy and protein requirements based on lifestyle, age, sex, and any chronic diseases. Hence, a clinical dietitian can help with a complete diet chart.

Those who follow a vegan diet can include whole grains like *ragi*, *bajra*, barley, quinoa, bulgur, *dalia*, buckwheat, millet, nuts and pulses such as different *dals* — yellow, green, red, black, dry beans — *rajma*, *lobia*, soya beans, tofu, peas, chickpeas, black *chana*, corn, mushroom, colourful seasonal fruits and vegetables which can reduce inflammation and support healthy weight management. A vegan diet is good for liver health as it significantly reduces saturated fat, refined carbohydrates, salt and sugary foodstuffs and lowers the risk of NAFLD (Non-Alcoholic Fatty Liver Diseases). Vitamin B12 is easily found only in animal sources. To get this vitamin, vegans should take supplements or fortified foods.

Is it tough to follow a vegan diet?

Becoming a vegan isn't as tough as we imagine it to be. Many vegans use non-dairy products, including soya or almond, soya-based cheeses and spreads, as well as egg replacements. With careful planning, a vegan diet can be very healthy. Nowadays, many fortified foods are available in the market like calcium and Vitamin D-fortified fruit juices, iodine-fortified salt, iron-fortified cereal, almond milk, etc. Rosemary, chamomile, blue tea, butterfly pea flower tea and essential seeds like chia seeds, sesame seeds, sunflower seeds, etc., are rich in antioxidants, and vitamins. Vitamins D and E help to boost immunity, reduce free radicals, act as anti-cancer shield, and also improve the digestive process and support a healthy gut.

The need for a culturally competent practice of psychology has become an important issue today. Continuous globalisation has led to an increase in the intercultural interactions between different communities. These interactions have led to the exchanging of cultural knowledge, ideas and forms of healing. Different forms of healing are becoming popular as different cultural and religious identities continue to mix.

As a result of intercultural interactions, patients from different cultural communities have started knocking on psychologists' doors demanding for a culturally equipped practice of psychology. This also led to the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM 5) — the principal book of psychological practice, to come up with cultural notions of distress and disorders, thus, trying to inject multicultural sensitivity.

While the inclusion of cultural bound syndromes in the DSM 5 is a step forward in creating a culturally incorporative space, Western psychology still has a long way to go for it to become culturally competent. Inclusion of minority voices and communities belonging to different cultures in the Western mental health narrative has become important more than ever and there is a lot of work that needs to be done in that area.

Spiritualistic as well as religious healings have always occupied an important

part in the way psychology is practised in India. The notions of Westernised psychotherapy are ill-fitted with the masses of the country. The practice of therapy in the country has historically built itself on a religious framework. There also exists the hierarchical difference between the facilitator of therapy and the patient, which

has made an equal alliance between the therapist and patient impossible. Due to hegemonic differences, the patient also lacked the power to make decisions or have a say in their own treatment (Manickam, 2010). With a religious as well as spiritual approach to psychotherapy in India, Western psychotherapy — sans

its cultural understanding and lack of multicultural competence, may find it difficult to fit within the mental health narrative of the country.

An increased awareness regarding the importance of cultural representation, and the slow, yet nonetheless, creation of spaces for minority voices has led to debates regarding diversity and inclusion in Western psychology.

Along with this, recognition of indigenous narratives has been extremely important in making psychology a truly inclusive and collaborative space. Embracing indigenous narratives and acknowledging the communities' relationship with Nature as part of rehabilitation practices and therapy — recognising the cultural spaces that the therapist and clients belong to and using those culturally different spaces to foster a multicultural one should be the goal of an inclusive psychotherapy programme (Tummala-Narra, 2015).

With Western psychology already on its way to achieving multicultural sensitivity, it is important for the psychological practices used in India to do the same. Being a land divided on the basis of caste, class, culture and religion, it is important for therapists and therapists to understand the indigenous communities' realities and socio-cultural spaces to be able to operate in an inclusive way.

A doctor in the hills

Dr. Eulius Sheldon Downs and his ‘beauty parlour operations’ made the lives of Garo women easier.



In spite of the British Government’s intention to provide medical service throughout India – with a civil surgeon in every major town, it was not possible for them to cover the interior regions of the country. As a result, people living in the Garo Hills of erstwhile Assam continued to depend on native doctors termed by the missionaries as witch doctors because of their reliance on sacrifice to evil spirits.

Dr. Eulius Sheldon Downs, a medical doctor and his wife, Gladys, a trained nurse, were members of the first American Baptist missionary medical team posted to the Garo Hills. When Dr. Downs approached the Mission Board in New York, expressing his desire to serve in India, the Board offered the choice of either joining a large city hospital as the head of the Department of Radiology, or a hospital in the jungle area of Assam where a doctor was urgently required. Despite a warning by the Board that the tribes in the Garo Hills were former headhunters, Dr. Downs opted for the second choice and was pleasantly surprised when upon his arrival at Tura, he was greeted by friendly people with gifts.

In his autobiography written in 1988, at the age of 86, Dr. Downs narrated interesting anecdotes about his 40 years of experience at Tura. Native medicine practitioners would often advise their patients not to accept blood transfusions from missionary doctors, even when in a serious condition, on the plea that American blood was different from that of the Garos. To allay such fears, Dr. Downs put a drop of his blood under a microscope, alongside a drop of blood belonging to a Garo man and asked the latter to identify his own blood. It was only when the Garo man failed to do so that his patients could be convinced.

The story of the ‘beauty parlour operations’ performed by Dr. Downs was another interesting experience narrated in his autobiography. Traditionally, it was customary for Garo women to wear large brass earrings, the weight of the rings being a symbol of their status. The earrings, which often reached their shoulders, were heavy, leaving the women with stretched earlobes. During the First World War, many women were tempted to sell their earrings as the British – who required brass for use in armaments, offered a high price for them. When brass was no longer available after the end of the war, compelling the young women to change the style of their earrings to smaller and lighter weight aluminium ones, they found themselves left with long flapping earlobes.

A remedy to this problem – suggested by Dr. Downs, was the ‘beauty parlour operation’ performed by cutting off the hanging lobes and stitching them to the proper stylish length. Dr. Downs narrates how some women were quite fussy about the length of the earrings they wanted. Generally performed on days of the weekly *haat* or market at Tura, when thousands of women frequented the markets, these operations were sometimes performed under local anaesthesia, though many women preferred to have it done without its use. The wound healed quickly and a small piece of sterilised bamboo stick was left inside the ear hole. The ‘beauty parlour operations’ in Tura resulted in the disappearance of the tradition of wearing brass earrings.
